| 8  | (a) The attorney general may initiate an investigation or           |
| 9  | prosecution of a suspected violation of a statute, including a      |
| 10 | suspected criminal offense, relating to:                            |
| 11 | (1) consumer protection;  |
| 12 | (2) insurance;  |
| 13 | (3) fraud; or   |
| 14 | (4) any part of the financial industry that may be                  |
| 15 | regulated by an agency of this state.                               |
| 16 | (b) A county or district attorney may not prosecute an              |
| 17 | offense for which the attorney general has begun an official        |
| 18 | investigation or a prosecution. The attorney general may not        |
| 19 | prosecute an offense for which a county or district attorney having |
| 20 | jurisdiction has begun an official investigation or a prosecution.  |
