- 2 relating to the presence of open water lifeguards on all public
- 3 beaches in this state.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 61.011(d), Natural Resources Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (d) The commissioner shall promulgate rules, consistent
- 8 with the policies established in this section, on the following
- 9 matters only:
- 10 (1) acquisition by local governments or other
- 11 appropriate entities or public dedication of access ways sufficient
- 12 to provide adequate public ingress and egress to and from the beach
- within the area described in Subdivision (6);
- 14 (2) protection of the public easement from erosion or
- 15 reduction caused by development or other activities on adjacent
- 16 land and beach cleanup and maintenance;
- 17 (3) local government prohibitions of vehicular
- 18 traffic on public beaches, provision of off-beach parking, and
- 19 other minimum measures needed to mitigate for any adverse effect on
- 20 public access and dune areas;
- 21 (4) imposition of beach access, user, or parking fees
- 22 and reasonable exercises of the police power by local governments
- 23 with respect to public beaches;
- 24 (5) contents and certification of beach access and use

- 1 plans and standards for local government review of construction on
- 2 land adjacent to and landward of public beaches;
- 3 (6) construction on land adjacent to and landward of
- 4 public beaches and lying in the area either up to the first public
- 5 road generally parallel to the beach or to any closer public road
- 6 not parallel to the beach, or to within 1,000 feet of mean high
- 7 tide, whichever is greater, that affects or may affect public
- 8 access to and use of public beaches; [and]
- 9 (7) the temporary suspension under Section 61.0185 of
- 10 enforcement of the prohibition against encroachments on and
- 11 interferences with the public beach easement and the ability of a
- 12 property owner to make repairs to a house while a suspension is in
- 13 effect; and
- 14 (8) provision of an appropriate number of lifeguards
- for each public beach consistent with the requirements of Section
- 16 61.027.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 61, Natural Resources
- 18 Code, is amended by adding Section 61.027 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 61.027. LIFEGUARDS. (a) The land office shall
- 20 establish a program to provide for the placement of an appropriate
- 21 number of lifeguards on each public beach in this state.
- 22 (b) The land office may employ lifeguards directly or may
- 23 contract with a municipality, county, or other political
- 24 <u>subdivision under Chapter 791, Government Code, for lifeguard</u>
- 25 services.
- 26 (c) Each lifeguard employed by the land office or providing
- 27 lifeguard services under an interlocal contract with a

- 1 <u>municipality</u>, county, or other political subdivision must:
- 2 (1) have completed a training program for open water
- 3 lifeguards that meets the requirements of a lifeguard agency
- 4 certification program recognized by the land office; and
- 5 (2) be certified as an emergency medical technician
- 6 under Chapter 773, Health and Safety Code.
- 7 <u>(d) The land office may recognize the United States</u>
- 8 Lifesaving Association's lifeguard agency certification program
- 9 for purposes of Subsection (c)(1).
- 10 (e) Notwithstanding any other law, a municipality, county,
- or other political subdivision may not provide lifeguard services
- for a public beach except under an interlocal contract with the land
- 13 office.
- 14 (f) The commissioner may adopt rules to implement this
- 15 section.
- 16 SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2005, the
- 17 commissioner of the General Land Office shall adopt rules required
- 18 by Section 61.027, Natural Resources Code, as added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 4. Notwithstanding Section 61.027(e), Natural
- 20 Resources Code, as added by this Act, a municipality, county, or
- 21 other political subdivision that is providing lifeguard services
- for a public beach on the effective date of this Act may continue to
- 23 provide those services until the General Land Office establishes
- 24 the program required by Section 61.027, Natural Resources Code, as
- 25 added by this Act.
- 26 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
