- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5
- SECTION 1. Section 29.908, Education Code, is amended to 6
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 29.908. EARLY [MIDDLE] COLLEGE EDUCATION [PILOT]
- PROGRAM. (a) The commissioner shall establish and administer an 9
- early [a middle] college education [pilot] program for students who 10
- are at risk of dropping out of school or who wish to accelerate 11
- completion of the high school program [completion]. For purposes 12
- 13 of this <u>subsection</u> [section], "student at risk of dropping out of
- school" has the meaning assigned by Section 29.081. 14
- (b) The program must: 15
- (1) provide for a course of study that enables a 16
- participating student to combine high school courses and 17
- college-level courses during grade levels 9 through [11 and] 12; 18
- 19 (2) allow a participating student to complete high
- school and, on or before the fifth anniversary of the date of the 20
- student's first day of high school, receive [at least] a high school 21
- 22 diploma and either:
- 23 (A) an associate degree; or
- 24 (B) at least 60 semester credit hours toward a

2	(3) include articulation agreements [under Subchapter
3	T, Chapter 61, with colleges, universities, and technical schools
4	in this state to provide a participating student access to
5	postsecondary educational and training opportunities at a [on the
6	campus of the] college, university, or technical school; and
7	(4) provide a participating student flexibility in
8	class scheduling and academic mentoring.
9	(b-1) Each articulation agreement under Subsection (b)(3)
10	must address:
11	(1) curriculum alignment;
12	(2) instructional materials;
13	(3) the instructional calendar;
14	(4) courses of study;
15	(5) eligibility of students for higher education
16	<pre>financial assistance;</pre>
17	(6) student enrollment and attendance;
18	(7) grading periods and policies; and
19	(8) administration of statewide assessment
20	instruments under Subchapter B, Chapter 39.
21	(b-2) The P-16 Council established under Section 61.077
22	shall provide guidance in case of any conflict that arises between
23	parties to an articulation agreement under Subsection (b)(3).
24	(c) A student participating in the program is entitled to
25	the benefits of the Foundation School Program in proportion to the
26	amount of time spent by the student on high school courses, in
27	accordance with rules adopted by the commissioner, while completing

- 1 the course of study established by the applicable articulation
- 2 <u>agreement under Subsection (b)(3)</u>. The commissioner may accept
- 3 gifts, grants, and donations from any source, including private and
- 4 nonprofit organizations, to pay any costs of the program not
- 5 covered by the student's Foundation School Program benefits.
- 6 (d) The commissioner <u>may adopt rules as necessary to</u>
- 7 administer the program. The rules may provide for giving
- 8 preference in receiving program benefits to a student who is in the
- 9 first generation of the student's family to attend college and may
- 10 establish other distinctions or criteria based on student need.
- 11 <u>The commissioner</u> shall consult the Texas Higher Education
- 12 Coordinating Board in [establishing and] administering the
- 13 program. The P-16 Council may make recommendations, including
- 14 recommendations for rules, concerning administration of the
- 15 program.
- 16 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
