- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 205.001(2), Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (2) "Acupuncture <u>and oriental medicine</u>" means:
- 8 (A) the nonsurgical, nonincisive insertion of an
- 9 acupuncture needle and the application of moxibustion to specific
- 10 areas of the human body as a primary mode of therapy to treat and
- 11 mitigate a human condition, including evaluation and assessment of
- 12 the condition; and
- 13 (B) the administration or recommendation of
- 14 thermal or electrical treatments, [or the recommendation of]
- 15 dietary guidelines, energy flow exercise, or dietary or herbal
- 16 supplements in conjunction with the treatment described by

- 18 SECTION 2. Section 205.002, Occupations Code, is amended to

- Sec. 205.002. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The Texas State
- 21 Board of Acupuncture Examiners is subject to Chapter 325,
- 22 Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 205.101, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 2 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 3 follows:
- 4 (a) Subject to the advice and approval of the medical board,
- 5 the acupuncture board shall:
- 6 (1) establish qualifications for an acupuncturist to
- 7 practice in this state;
- 8 (2) establish minimum education and training
- 9 requirements necessary for the acupuncture board to recommend that
- 10 the medical board issue a license to practice acupuncture;
