S.B. No. 1202

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the coordination of colonia initiatives and services to colonia residents.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 775.002, Government Code, is amended by amending Subsections (c) and (d) and adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:

(c) The colonia initiatives coordinator shall ~~may~~ work with the other agencies and local officials involved in colonia projects in the state to:

(1) coordinate efforts to address colonia issues;

(2) identify nonprofit self-help groups to help with colonia initiatives;

(3) set goals for each state fiscal year for colonia initiatives in the state, including goals to:

(A) address easement problems; and

(B) ensure that water and wastewater connections are extended from distribution lines to houses located in colonias;

(4) ensure that the goals set under this subsection are met each state fiscal year; and

(5) coordinate state outreach efforts to nonborder colonias and to political subdivisions capable of providing water and wastewater services to nonborder colonias.

(d) The following agencies shall designate an officer or

employee of the agency to serve as the agency's liaison for colonia initiatives:

- (1) the office of the attorney general;
- (2) the ~~[Texas]~~ Department of State Health Services;
- (3) the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs;
- (4) the Texas ~~[Natural Resource Conservation]~~ Commission on Environmental Quality; ~~[and]~~
- (5) the Texas Water Development Board;
- (6) the Office of Rural Community Affairs;
- (7) the Office of State-Federal Relations;
- (8) the Texas Department of Insurance; and
- (9) the Texas Department of Transportation.

(f) In coordinating colonia initiatives under this section, the coordinator shall consider the advice and recommendations of the Colonia Resident Advisory Committee established under Section 2306.584.

SECTION 2. Chapter 775, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 775.004 to read as follows:

Sec. 775.004. DEVELOPMENT OF STRATEGY TO ASSIST COLONIA RESIDENTS. (a) To improve services delivered to colonia residents, the colonia initiatives coordinator shall work with the Colonia Resident Advisory Committee established under Section 2306.584.

(b) The coordinator may establish an advisory committee similar to the Colonia Resident Advisory Committee to supplement the efforts of the Colonia Resident Advisory Committee by providing

1 representation for colonia residents in counties that are not
2 represented by a member of the Colonia Resident Advisory Committee.

3 (c) The coordinator shall consider the advice of the Colonia
4 Resident Advisory Committee and any committee established under
5 Subsection (b) regarding the needs of colonia residents.

6 (d) Based on the advice received under Subsection (c) and
7 any recommendations received from the agencies listed in Section
8 775.002(d), the coordinator shall define and develop a strategy to
9 address the needs of colonia residents and make recommendations to
10 the legislature based on that strategy. The coordinator shall
11 recommend appropriate programs, grants, and activities to the
12 legislature.

13 SECTION 3. Section 2306.585, Government Code, is amended by
14 adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

15 (c) The advisory committee shall advise the colonia
16 initiatives coordinator as provided by Section 775.004.

17 SECTION 4. (a) Not later than December 1, 2006, the colonia
18 initiatives coordinator shall submit a report to the lieutenant
19 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and each
20 member of the legislature.

21 (b) The report must:

22 (1) document:

23 (A) the recommendations provided by the Colonia
24 Resident Advisory Committee and any other similar committee to the
25 colonia initiatives coordinator; and

26 (B) the actions taken by the colonia initiatives
27 coordinator to address the recommendations;

1 (2) outline a long-range plan to improve the quality
2 of life of colonia residents and propose legislation to implement
3 the plan; and

4 (3) recommend appropriate programs, grants, and
5 activities to address the needs of colonia residents.

6 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
10 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
