## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to a statewide assessment and accountability system for
- 3 public institutions of higher education.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Subchapter EE to read as follows:

## 7 SUBCHAPTER EE. STATEWIDE ASSESSMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEM

- 8 Sec. 61.9751. DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF SYSTEM;
- 9 SYSTEM COMPONENTS. (a) The board shall develop and implement a
- 10 statewide assessment and accountability system to measure the
- 11 performance of each institution of higher education, including the
- 12 <u>institution's progress in achieving performance goals, in the</u>
- 13 following areas:
- 14 (1) the number of students to whom the institution
- 15 provides higher education services;
- 16 (2) the number of students succeeding in higher
- 17 education at the institution, as measured at least in part by the
- number of degrees or certificates awarded;
- 19 (3) institutional research, as measured at least in
- 20 part by the level of federal science or engineering research
- 21 funding awarded to the institution;
- 22 (4) the overall excellence of the institution, as
- 23 measured at least in part by the number of the institution's
- 24 programs or services that are nationally recognized;

- 1 (5) the institution's effectiveness in managing and
- 2 using money available to the institution from appropriations,
- 3 tuition charges, or any other source; and
- 4 (6) any other area determined by the board to be
- 5 necessary to effectively evaluate the performance of a particular
- 6 type of institution.
- 7 (b) As part of the system, the board, in consultation with
- 8 appropriate officers of each institution, shall place each
- 9 institution in an institutional peer group with like institutions
- of higher education in this state and other states, as determined by
- 11 the primary role or mission of the institutions, such as research,
- 12 teaching, or the provision of graduate education. At least
- 13 <u>biennially</u>, the board shall review the institutions assigned to
- 14 each peer group and modify the peer group as necessary to reflect
- changes in the role or mission of one or more institutions.
- 16 (c) The board by rule shall adopt a method to assess and rate
- 17 the performance, including progress in achieving performance
- 18 goals, of each institution of higher education in each area
- 19 identified under Subsection (a) and to use the assessments and
- 20 ratings for each area to assess and rate the overall performance of
- 21 <u>each institution</u>. The board may adopt different ratings methods
- 22 for different institutional peer groups. The board may provide for
- 23 ratings in any form, including in the form of a ranking or score,
- 24 except that the ratings method must provide a clear indication of
- 25 whether an institution's performance is acceptable or unacceptable
- 26 and must allow an assessment based on the specific context and
- 27 circumstances associated with each institution. The board may also

- 1 provide for a rating that indicates a need for improvement or that
- 2 recognizes the degree of change in an institution's performance
- 3 from one year to the next or over a period of years specified by the
- 4 board.
- 5 (d) The board shall develop and implement a method to
- 6 recognize each institution of higher education assigned the highest
- 7 rating in overall performance under Section 61.9752.
- 8 Sec. 61.9752. ANNUAL ASSESSMENT. (a) Each year the board
- 9 shall assess and rate the performance of each institution of higher
- 10 education using the assessment and accountability system developed
- 11 under this subchapter and determine whether to change an
- institution's current performance rating.
- 13 (b) In assessing and rating an institution's performance,
- 14 the board shall compare an institution's performance for each area
- identified under Section 61.9751(a) to standards established under
- 16 state law, including standards adopted by the board, and to the
- 17 performance of other in-state and out-of-state institutions of
- 18 higher education in the same institutional peer group.
- 19 Sec. 61.9753. REPORTS; LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT. (a) Not
- 20 later than January 15 of each year, the board shall report
- 21 assessment results to each institution of higher education and to
- 22 the legislative oversight committee on higher education
- established under Section 54.0515. The board shall also report the
- results of the annual assessments on the board's Internet website.
- 25 (b) Not later than February 15 of each odd-numbered year,
- 26 the legislative oversight committee shall make any recommendations
- 27 the committee considers necessary for legislative action

- 1 concerning the assessment and accountability system or the
- 2 assessment results.
- 3 Sec. 61.9754. INFORMATION FOR ASSESSMENTS. To the extent
- 4 practicable, the board shall obtain the information necessary for
- 5 the board to perform its duties under this subchapter from other
- 6 agencies or from reports submitted to the board for other purposes
- 7 by institutions of higher education. Each institution of higher
- 8 education shall provide to the board, at the time and in the form
- 9 required by the board, any other information necessary for the
- 10 board to perform its duties under this subchapter.
- 11 Sec. 61.9755. TUITION INCREASE PROHIBITED. If for any
- 12 academic year an institution of higher education receives a rating
- 13 under the assessment and accountability system that indicates
- 14 <u>unacceptable overall performance, for a subsequent academic year</u>
- 15 the institution may not increase the rate of tuition charged under
- 16 <u>Section 54.0513 or any other law granting the institution or its</u>
- 17 governing board discretion to set the tuition rate, except as
- 18 necessary to reflect cost-of-living increases as determined by the
- 19 board, until the institution receives a rating that indicates
- 20 acceptable overall performance.
- 21 Sec. 61.9756. RULES. The board shall adopt rules as
- 22 necessary to implement this subchapter.
- Sec. 61.9757. INITIAL REPORTS, COMMENTS, RECOMMENDATIONS,
- 24 AND IMPLEMENTATION. (a) Not later than November 1, 2005, the board
- 25 shall submit to the legislative oversight committee on higher
- 26 education an initial report on the board's proposed statewide
- 27 higher education as sessment and accountability system for

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- 1 institutions of higher education other than public junior colleges.
- 2 Not later than December 1, 2005, the committee shall provide its
- 3 comments and recommendations to the board concerning the proposed
- 4 system for those institutions of higher education. The board shall
- 5 consider the committee's comments and recommendations in adopting
- 6 and implementing the system.
- 7 (b) Not later than March 1, 2006, the board shall implement
- 8 the assessment and accountability system and make the initial
- 9 institutional assessments of institutions of higher education
- 10 other than public junior colleges.
- 11 (c) Not later than November 1, 2006, the board shall submit
- 12 to the legislative oversight committee an initial report on the
- 13 board's proposed statewide higher education assessment and
- 14 <u>accountability system for public junior colleges. Not later than</u>
- 15 December 1, 2006, the committee shall provide its comments and
- 16 <u>recommendations</u> to the board concerning the proposed system for
- 17 public junior colleges. The board shall consider the committee's
- 18 comments and recommendations in adopting and implementing the
- 19 system.
- 20 (d) Not later than March 1, 2007, the board shall implement
- 21 the assessment and accountability system for public junior colleges
- 22 and make the initial institutional assessments of the junior
- 23 colleges.
- (e) The board as it considers appropriate may apply this
- 25 section to public state colleges and public technical institutes
- 26 according to the provisions applicable to public junior colleges.
- 27 (f) This section expires June 1, 2007.

- 1 Sec. 61.9758. COMPOSITION OF PEER GROUPS: INCLUSION OF
- 2 OUT-OF-STATE INSTITUTIONS. Notwithstanding Section 61.9751(b) or
- 3 61.9752(b), the board is not required to include institutions of
- 4 <u>higher education in other states in institutional peer groups or to</u>
- 5 <u>use those institutions as part of the statewide higher education</u>
- 6 assessment and accountability system until September 1, 2007. This
- 7 <u>section expires January 1, 2008.</u>
- 8 SECTION 2. Sections 54.0515(b) and (f), Education Code, are
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 (b) The legislative oversight committee on higher education
- is composed of 12 members as follows:
- 12 (1) the presiding officer of the standing committee of
- each house of the legislature with primary jurisdiction over higher
- 14 education;
- 15 (2) the presiding officer of the Senate Finance
- 16 Committee or its successor and of the House Appropriations
- 17 <u>Committee or its successor;</u>
- 18 (3) four additional [six] members of the senate
- 19 appointed by the lieutenant governor; and
- 20 (4) four additional [(2) six] members of the house of
- 21 representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of
- 22 representatives.
- 23 (f) The committee shall:
- 24 (1) meet at the call of either chair;
- 25 (2) monitor and regularly report to the legislature on
- 26 each institution of higher education's compliance with the
- 27 requirements of Subsection (e); [and]

- 1 (3) receive and review information concerning the
- 2 affordability and accessibility of higher education, including the
- 3 impact of tuition deregulation; and
- 4 (4) perform duties prescribed by Subchapter EE,
- 5 Chapter 61, concerning the statewide higher education assessment
- 6 and accountability system.
- 7 SECTION 3. (a) On October 15, 2005, the presiding officer
- 8 of the standing committee of each house of the legislature with
- 9 primary jurisdiction over higher education and the presiding
- 10 officer of the Senate Finance Committee or its successor and of the
- 11 House Appropriations Committee or its successor shall begin serving
- 12 as members of the legislative oversight committee on higher
- education in accordance with Section 54.0515(b), Education Code, as
- 14 amended by this Act.
- 15 (b) As soon as practicable after this Act takes effect, the
- 16 lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of representatives
- 17 shall modify the composition of the committee as necessary to
- comply with Section 54.0515(b), Education Code, as amended by this
- 19 Act.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
