## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to creating reasonable regulation of the storage,
- 3 discharge, safe use, and oversight of fireworks.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2154.052(b), Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:

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- 7 (b) The commissioner shall adopt and the state fire marshal
- 8 shall administer rules the commissioner considers necessary for the
- 9 protection, safety, and preservation of life and property,
- 10 including rules regulating:
- 11 (1) the issuance of licenses and permits to persons
- 12 engaged in manufacturing, selling, storing, possessing, or
- 13 transporting fireworks in this state;
- 14 (2) the conduct of public fireworks displays; and
- 15 (3) the safe storage of Fireworks 1.3G and Fireworks
- 16 1.4G, including rules regulating the distance that fireworks may be
- 17 stored from residential dwellings.
- SECTION 2. Section 2154.054, Occupations Code, is amended
- 19 to read as follows:
- 20 2154.054. ADVISORY COUNCIL. (a) The commissioner may
- 21 [shall] establish an advisory council to assist the commissioner in
- 22 administering this chapter and in proposing rules.
- 23 (b) The council is composed of five members who are:
- 24 (1) one representative of a county fire marshal's

- 1 office;
- 2 (2) one representative from the property and casualty
- 3 insurance industry;
- 4 (3) one representative who is a children's physician;
- 5 and
- 6 (4) two representatives from the fireworks industry.
- 7 (c) The Texas Pyrotechnic Association may, on request by the
- 8 commissioner, recommend individuals for appointment to the two
- 9 fireworks industry representative positions on the council.
- 10 (d) A council member serves at the will of the commissioner
- 11 and may not be reimbursed for service.
- 12 (e) The council shall periodically review rules relating to
- 13 this chapter and recommend changes in the rules to promote public
- 14 safety and property protection, including changes that could lower
- 15 <u>insurance costs, to</u> the commissioner.
- 16 (f) Notwithstanding Section 2001.031, Government Code, the
- 17 commissioner may [shall] submit all proposed changes and additions
- 18 to the rules that relate to administration of this chapter to the
- 19 council for development. If the commissioner does not approve a
- 20 rule developed by the council, the commissioner may [shall]
- 21 indicate to the council the reasons that the commissioner did not
- 22 approve the rule and return the rule to the council for further
- 23 development.
- SECTION 3. Section 2154.055(c), Occupations Code, is
- amended to read as follows:
- 26 (c) The commissioner may administer the program or may
- 27 require the program to [shall] be administered by the advisory

- 1 council established under Section 2154.054. The commissioner must
- 2 approve a program that the advisory council proposes to present.
- 3 The program may not promote the use of fireworks and must be focused
- 4 <u>entirely on safety.</u>
- 5 SECTION 4. Section 2154.251(a), Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A person may not:
- 8 (1) explode or ignite fireworks:
- 9 <u>(A)</u> within 600 feet of any church, a hospital,
- 10 [other than] a veterinary hospital or facility that houses animals,
- 11 an asylum, a licensed child care center, or a public or private
- 12 primary or secondary school or institution of higher education
- 13 unless the person receives authorization in writing from that
- 14 organization; or
- 15 (B) within 300 feet of a residential dwelling,
- 16 including a single-family home, condominium, duplex, triplex,
- apartment, multifamily housing, mobile home or manufactured home,
- 18 unless the person owns the dwelling or receives authorization in
- 19 writing from the person who owns the dwelling and, if applicable,
- 20 from an association representing all of the persons who reside in
- 21 the dwelling;
- 22 (2) sell at retail, explode, or ignite fireworks
- 23 within 300  $[\frac{100}{100}]$  feet of a place where flammable liquids or
- 24 flammable compressed gasses are stored and dispensed;
- 25 (3) explode or ignite fireworks within 300 [<del>100</del>] feet
- of a place where fireworks are stored or sold;
- 27 (4) ignite or discharge fireworks in or from a motor

- 1 vehicle;
- 2 (5) place ignited fireworks in, or throw ignited
- 3 fireworks at, a motor vehicle;
- 4 (6) conduct a public fireworks display that includes
- 5 Fireworks 1.3G unless the person is a licensed pyrotechnic
- 6 operator;
- 7 (7) conduct a proximate display of fireworks that
- 8 includes Fireworks 1.3G or Fireworks 1.4G as defined in NFPA 1126
- 9 Standards for the Use of Pyrotechnics Before a Proximate Audience
- 10 unless the person is a licensed pyrotechnic special effects
- operator and has the approval of the local fire prevention officer;
- 12 or
- 13 (8) sell, store, manufacture, distribute, or display
- 14 fireworks except as provided by this chapter or rules adopted by
- 15 the commissioner under this chapter.
- SECTION 5. Section 2154.052(e), Occupations Code, is
- 17 repealed.
- SECTION 6. (a) The changes in law made by this Act apply
- only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 20 Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before
- 21 the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense ocurrs
- 22 before that date.
- 23 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 24 Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 26 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
