- 23 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 24 (a) Except as provided by Section 522.033, an original

- 1 commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit
- 2 expires <u>five</u> [six] years after the applicant's next birthday.
- 3 (b) A commercial driver's license or commercial driver
- 4 learner's permit issued to a person holding a Texas Class A, B, C,
- 5 or M license that would expire one year or more after the date of
- 6 issuance of the commercial driver's license or commercial driver

- 9 (c) A commercial driver's license or commercial driver
- 10 learner's permit issued to a person holding a Texas Class A, B, C,
- or M license that would expire less than one year after the date of
- 12 issuance of the commercial driver's license or commercial driver
- 13 learner's permit or that has been expired for less than one year
- 14 expires five [six] years after the expiration date shown on the
- 15 Class A, B, C, or M license.
- 16 (d) A commercial driver's license or commercial driver
- 17 learner's permit issued to a person holding a Texas Class A, B, C,
- or M license that has been expired for at least one year but not more
- 19 than two years expires five [six] years after the applicant's last
- 20 birthday.
- 21 SECTION 3. Subsection (b), Section 522.052, Transportation
- 22 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 23 (b) A renewal of a commercial driver's license that has been
- 24 expired for less than one year expires five [six] years after the
- 25 expiration date shown on the commercial driver's license.
- SECTION 4. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- 27 only to a commercial driver's license or commercial driver
