A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

relating to the issuance or renewal of a commercial driver's license and the expiration of a commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 522.042, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

- (a) The department may issue a commercial driver's license with endorsements:
- (1) authorizing the driving of a vehicle transporting hazardous materials, subject to the requirements of Title 49 C.F.R. Part 1572;
- (2) authorizing the towing of a double or triple trailer or a trailer over a specified weight;
- (3) authorizing the driving of a vehicle carrying passengers;

(4) authorizing the driving of a tank vehicle;

- (5) representing a combination of hazardous materials and tank vehicle endorsements; or
- (6) authorizing the driving of a school bus, as defined by Section 541.201.

SECTION 2. Subsections (a) through (d), Section 522.051, Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:

- (a) Except as provided by Section 522.033, an original commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit expires $\underline{\text{five}}$ [six] years after the applicant's next birthday.
- (b) A commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit issued to a person holding a Texas Class A, B, C, or M license that would expire one year or more after the date of issuance of the commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit expires <u>five</u> [six] years after the applicant's next birthday.
- (c) A commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit issued to a person holding a Texas Class A, B, C, or M license that would expire less than one year after the date of issuance of the commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit or that has been expired for less than one year expires five [six] years after the expiration date shown on the Class A, B, C, or M license.

 (d) A commercial driver's license or commercial driver
- (d) A commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit issued to a person holding a Texas Class A, B, C, or M license that has been expired for at least one year but not more than two years expires $\underline{\text{five}}$ [$\underline{\text{six}}$] years after the applicant's last birthday.

SECTION 3. Subsection (b), Section 522.052, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

- (b) A renewal of a commercial driver's license that has been expired for less than one year expires $\underline{\text{five}}$ [$\underline{\text{six}}$] years after the expiration date shown on the commercial driver's license.
- SECTION 4. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies only to a commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit that is issued or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- (b) A commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit that was issued or renewed before the effective date of this Act is covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
