A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a college entrance examination preparation pilot
3	program.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 29, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter K to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER K. COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMINATION
8	PREPARATION PILOT PROGRAM
9	Sec. 29.401. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "College entrance examination" means an
11	assessment instrument, such as the Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT)
12	and the American College Test (ACT), used by colleges and
13	universities in determining student admissions.
14	(2) "Preparation course" means a college entrance
15	examination preparation course.
16	(3) "Program" means the college entrance examination
17	preparation pilot program.
18	Sec. 29.402. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM; GUIDELINES. (a)
19	From funds appropriated for the purpose, the agency shall establish
20	a college entrance examination preparation pilot program for the
21	purpose of enabling a participating campus to offer a college
22	entrance examination preparation course to participating students.
23	(b) The agency shall adopt clear guidelines for
24	participating campuses to follow in implementing the program.

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1	Sec. 29.403. APPROVED VENDORS. (a) The agency shall
2	compile a list of vendors approved by the agency to provide
3	preparation course instruction for participating campuses.
4	(b) The agency may approve a vendor for inclusion on the
5	list only if the vendor:
6	(1) has a proven record of successfully increasing
7	students' scores on college entrance examinations;
8	(2) is financially sound; and
9	(3) uses for a participating campus's preparation
10	course a set of comprehensive materials and instructors with the
11	experience and skills necessary for successfully teaching a
12	preparation course.
13	Sec. 29.404. CAMPUS ELIGIBILITY. A campus is eligible to
14	participate in the program only if:
15	(1) at least 40 percent of the students enrolled at the
16	campus are educationally disadvantaged; or
17	(2) the campus meets the criteria specified by Section
18	1114(a)(1), No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (20 U.S.C. Section
19	<u>6314).</u>
20	Sec. 29.405. APPLICATION PROCESS. (a) A campus, or a
21	school district on behalf of one or more district campuses, may
22	apply to the agency to participate in the program. The application
23	submitted by the campus or district must include a detailed
24	proposal that:
25	(1) describes the manner in which the campus proposes
26	to:
27	(A) recruit students to and achieve and maintain

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1	strong student attendance and participation in the program; and
2	(B) assist participating students in completing
3	the preparation course and taking a college entrance examination;
4	(2) describes how the campus proposes to schedule a
5	preparation course so that the course does not interfere with
6	participating students' regular curriculum requirements or
7	extracurricular activities; and
8	(3) identifies a campus administrator or faculty
9	member who will serve as the campus program coordinator and who will
10	<u>be:</u>
11	(A) responsible for the logistical and support
12	requirements of the program; and
13	(B) accountable for the success of the program.
14	(b) On the basis of applications submitted under this
15	section, the agency shall select to participate in the program
16	campuses that are eligible to participate under Section 29.404.
17	Sec. 29.406. STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN PROGRAM. (a) A
18	participating campus shall establish a process for selecting
19	students to participate in the program.
20	(b) A student is eligible to participate in the program if
21	the student:
22	(1) is enrolled in the 11th grade at a participating
23	<pre>campus;</pre>
24	(2) is educationally disadvantaged or is from a family
25	considered to be low-income for purposes of Section 1114(a)(1), No
26	Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (20 U.S.C. Section 6314); and
27	(3) performed satisfactorily on the 10th grade

1	mathematics and English language arts assessment instruments
2	administered under Section 39.023(a).
3	Sec. 29.407. FUNDING; CAMPUS IMPLEMENTATION OF PROGRAM.
4	(a) A participating campus is entitled to receive a grant from the
5	agency in an amount, determined by the agency, sufficient to
6	implement the program.
7	(b) A participating campus shall select a vendor from the
8	agency's list of approved vendors under Section 29.403 to offer a
9	college entrance examination preparation course at the campus.
10	(c) A participating campus must provide for the logistical
11	necessities of the preparation course, such as the course's
12	location and transportation to the course, and supplies, such as
13	pencils and calculators.
14	(d) A participating campus's preparation course must
15	provide for:
16	(1) at least 25 hours of instruction per week;
17	(2) detailed student materials aligned with the
18	instruction;
19	(3) mathematics and verbal content and skill
20	remediation;
21	(4) at least three full-length practice examinations,
22	with prompt scoring, individualized review of results, and, if
23	appropriate, graded essay responses;
24	(5) incentives for attendance;
25	(6) access to online instruction for students who are
26	unable to attend a preparation course in person;
27	(7) Spanish language course guides;

1	(8) information sessions for family members; and
2	(9) additional resources for participating students,
3	such as study guides and additional practice items.
4	Sec. 29.408. EVALUATION; REPORT. (a) Each participating
5	campus shall, with the assistance of the vendor serving the campus,
6	report preparation course performance data to the agency. The
7	performance data must include aggregated student scores and
8	progress reports, including the college entrance examination
9	scores of participating students.
10	(b) The agency shall conduct an evaluation of the program
11	that is based on strong methodological practices. Each
12	participating campus shall cooperate with the agency to ensure an
13	effective evaluation.
14	(c) The agency shall report the results of the evaluation to
15	the legislature not later than the first day of each regular
16	legislative session.
17	Sec. 29.409. RULES. The commissioner shall adopt rules
18	necessary to administer this section.
19	SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
20	of this Act, the commissioner of education shall adopt rules for
21	implementing the college entrance examination preparation pilot
22	program as required by Subchapter K, Chapter 29, Education Code, as
23	added by this Act. The commissioner of education shall make the
24	college entrance examination preparation pilot program available
25	for school campus participation beginning with the 2005-2006 school
26	year.
27	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
