4	SECTION 1. Section 1305.002, Occupations Code, is amended
5	by adding Subdivisions (1-a) and (12-a) to read as follows:
6	<u>(1-a) "Agricultural use" means a use or activity</u>
7	involving agriculture, as defined by Section 11.002, Water Code,
8	other than the processing of an agricultural commodity.
9	(12-a) "Person" means an individual.
10	SECTION 2. Section 1305.003, Occupations Code, is amended
11	by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (d) and (e) to
12	read as follows:
13	(a) This chapter does not apply to:
14	(1) the installation of electrical equipment in a
15	ship, watercraft other than a floating building, railway rolling
16	stock, aircraft, or a motor vehicle other than a mobile home [or
17	<pre>recreational vehicle];</pre>
18	(2) the installation of electrical equipment
19	underground in a mine and in self-propelled mobile surface mining
20	machinery and its attendant electrical trailing cable;
21	(3) the installation of electrical equipment for
22	generation, transformation, transmission, or distribution of power
23	used exclusively to operate railway rolling stock or exclusively
24	for signaling and communications purposes;

3 (9) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or 4 repair of electrical equipment or associated wiring under the 5 exclusive control of a gas utility and used for communications or 6 metering or for the control, transmission, or distribution of 7 natural gas;

8 (10) thoroughfare lighting, traffic signals, 9 intelligent transportation systems, and telecommunications 10 controlled by a governmental entity;

(11) (11) electrical connections supplying heating, ventilation, and cooling and refrigeration equipment, including any required disconnect exclusively for the equipment, if the service is performed by a licensed air conditioning and refrigeration contractor under Chapter 1302;

16 (12) the design, installation, erection, repair, or 17 alteration of Class 1, Class 2, or Class 3 remote control, 18 signaling, or power-limited circuits, fire alarm circuits, optical 19 fiber cables, or communications circuits, including raceways, as 20 defined by the National Electrical Code;

(13) landscape irrigation installers, as necessary to perform the installation and maintenance of irrigation control systems, and landscapers, as necessary to perform the installation and maintenance of low-voltage exterior lighting and holiday lighting excluding any required power source;

26 (14) a person who is employed by and performs 27 electrical work solely for a private industrial business[τ

1 including a business] that operates a chemical plant, petrochemical 2 plant, refinery, natural gas plant, natural gas treating plant, 3 pipeline, or oil and gas exploration and production operation; 4 (15) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or 5 repair of elevators, escalators, or related equipment, excluding any required power source, regulated under Chapter 754, Health and 6 7 Safety Code; the installation, maintenance, alteration, 8 (16)οr repair of equipment or network facilities provided or utilized by a 9 cable operator, as that term is defined by 47 U.S.C. Section 522, as amended; [and] 12 (17)the location, design, construction, extension, maintenance, and installation of on-site sewage disposal systems in accordance with Chapter 366, Health and Safety Code, or an on-site sewage facility installer licensed by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality; 17 (18) electrical work performed on a building, structure, or equipment in agricultural use; and 19 (19) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or repair of well pumps and equipment in accordance with Chapter 1902. 20 (d) This chapter does not require a political subdivision of this state, including a school district or a municipality, to hold an electrical contractor license or an electrical sign contractor 23 license under this chapter to be authorized to employ a person to perform electrical work for the political subdivision.

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26 (e) Subsection (d) does not exempt an employee of a 27 political subdivision from the requirement of holding a license

under this chapter to perform electrical work. SECTION 3. Section 1305.153, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: Sec. 1305.153. [REQUIREMENTS FOR] MASTER ELECTRICIAN. (a) An applicant for a license as a master electrician must: (1) have at least 12,000 hours of on-the-job training under the supervision of a master electrician; and (2) pass а master electrician examination

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8 9 administered under this chapter.

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(b) A master electrician may: (1) perform all electrical work, including electrical 11 12 work performed by a master sign electrician and an electrical sign 13 contractor;

15 (3) verify compliance with on-the-job training requirements for issuance of a master electrician or master sign 16 electrician license; and 17

(2) supervise an electrician;

(4) serve as master of record for an electrical sign 18 19 contractor.

SECTION 4. Section 1305.160(b), Occupations Code, 20 is amended to read as follows: 21

(b) A person who holds a master sign electrician license 22 issued or recognized under this chapter may only be assigned to a 23 24 single electrical sign contractor, unless the master sign electrician owns more than 50 percent of the electrical sign 25 26 contracting business.

SECTION 5. Section 1305.161, Occupations Code, is amended 27

1 to read as follows:

2 Sec. 1305.161. ELECTRICAL APPRENTICE; TEMPORARY ELECTRICAL 3 <u>APPRENTICE</u>. (a) An applicant for a license as an electrical 4 apprentice must be [at least 16 years of age and be] engaged in the 5 process of learning and assisting in the installation of electrical 6 work <u>or electrical sign work</u> under the supervision of a licensed 7 master electrician <u>or a licensed master sign electrician, as</u> 8 appropriate.

9 (b) On the request of an applicant for an electrical 10 apprentice license, the executive director shall issue a temporary 11 electrical apprentice license that expires on the 45th day after 12 the date of issuance to an applicant who meets the qualifications 13 established by the executive director.

(c) The executive director by rule shall set the fee,
 establish the qualifications, and provide for the issuance of a
 temporary electrical apprentice license under this section.

SECTION 6. Subchapter D, Chapter 1305, Occupations Code, is
amended by adding Section 1305.1615 to read as follows:

Sec. 1305.1615. EMERGENCY ELECTRICIAN LICENSE. (a) The executive director by rule shall establish criteria and procedures for the issuance of an emergency electrician license following a disaster, as that term is defined by Section 418.004, Government Code, to a person licensed as an electrician in another state of the United States.
(b) An emergency license issued under this section expires

26 on the 90th day after the date of issuance.

27 (c) The commission, with the advice of the advisory board,

may adopt rules that provide for the extension of an emergency 1 2 license issued under this section. SECTION 7. Section 1305.168, Occupations Code, is amended 3 4 by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows: (d) The department shall offer online continuing education 5 6 courses for electricians through the department's Internet 7 website. SECTION 8. Section 1305.202, Occupations Code, is amended 8 to read as follows: 9 Sec. 1305.202. SCOPE OF MUNICIPAL OR REGIONAL LICENSE. 10 (a) A license to perform electrical work issued by a municipality 11 or region is valid only in the municipality or region or in another 12 municipality or region under a reciprocal agreement. 13 14 (b) A person who holds a license to perform electrical work 15 issued by a municipality or region that elects to discontinue its licensing program may apply for an equivalent license under this 16 17 chapter without complying with the applicable examination requirement if the person: 18 (1) held the municipal or regional license for the 19 preceding year; and 20 (2) submits an application for a license under this 21 chapter not later than the 90th day after the date the municipal or 22 23 regional licensing program is discontinued. 24 SECTION 9. Section 1305.167(d), Occupations Code, is 25 repealed. SECTION 10. (a) The Texas Department of Licensing and 26 Regulation shall issue a license without examination to a qualified 27

2 (e) An applicant for a license under this section as a 3 master sign electrician working in an area in which a municipal or 4 regional licensing program does not exist is required to have 5 completed at least 20,000 hours of on-the-job training under the 6 supervision of a master sign electrician.

7 (f) An applicant for a license under this section as a 8 journeyman electrician is required to have:

9 (1) completed at least 12,000 hours of on-the-job 10 training under the supervision of a master electrician;

11 (2) held a municipal or regional journeyman 12 electrician license for at least one year; or

13 (3) graduated from an electrical apprenticeship 14 program consisting of at least 576 hours of job-related education 15 and 8,000 hours of on-the-job training.

16 (g) An applicant for a license under this section as a 17 journeyman sign electrician is required to have:

18 (1) completed at least 12,000 hours of on-the-job 19 training under the supervision of a licensed master sign 20 electrician;

(2) held a municipal or regional journeyman sign
 electrician license for at least one year; or

(3) graduated from an electrical sign apprenticeship
 program consisting of at least 576 hours of job-related education
 and 8,000 hours of on-the-job training.

(h) An applicant for a license under this section as aresidential wireman is required to have:

(1) completed at least 8,000 hours of on-the-job
 training under the supervision of a licensed master electrician;
 (2) held a municipal or regional residential wireman

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4 license for at least one year; or

5 (3) graduated from a residential wireman 6 apprenticeship program consisting of at least 288 hours of 7 job-related education and 4,000 hours of on-the-job training.

8 (i) An applicant for a license under this section as a 9 maintenance electrician is required to have:

10 (1) completed at least 12,000 hours of on-the-job 11 training under the supervision of a master electrician;

12 (2) held a municipal or regional maintenance13 electrician license for at least one year; or

14 (3) graduated from an electrical maintenance 15 apprenticeship program consisting of at least 576 hours of 16 job-related education and 8,000 hours of on-the-job training.

(j) On-the-job training required by this section must be certified by a master electrician or master sign electrician, as appropriate.

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(k) This section expires September 1, 2007.

SECTION 11. (a) Notwithstanding Section 3(a)(1), Chapter 1062, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, an applicant for a license under that section must apply not later than December 31, 2005.

(b) For purposes of the issuance of a license under Section
3, Chapter 1062, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session,
2003:

1 (1) the executive director of the Texas Department of 2 Licensing and Regulation shall accept alternative documentation of 3 on-the-job experience approved by the department if the license 4 applicant is applying for a license in an area in which a municipal 5 or regional licensing program does not exist and is unable to 6 provide proof of on-the-job training certified by a master 7 electrician or master sign electrician, as appropriate; and

8 (2) a person applying for a license in an area in which 9 a municipal or regional licensing program exists is eligible only 10 for an equivalent license issued by the department.

(c) The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation shall publish at least one time in newspapers of general circulation in both large and small communities a notice of the extended deadlines established by this Act for obtaining a license under Section 3, Chapter 1062, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, as amended by this Act.

SECTION 12. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
