Section 42.012(b), Parks and Wildlife Code, is 6 amended to read as follows: 7 (b) The commission may set a lower fee or waive the fee or 8 license requirement for a resident who is under 17 years old, 65 9 years old or older, or participating in an event that is sponsored 10 or co-sponsored by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department with the 11 approval of the executive director. The commission shall waive the 12 fee for a resident who is a [qualified disabled] veteran. 13 14 SECTION 2. Section 42.014, Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended to read as follows: 15 Sec. 42.014. A license required by this subchapter is valid <u>from the date of issuance through the day</u> <u>before the first anniversary of the date of issuance</u> [<del>only during</del> <u>the period for which it is issued without regard to the date on</u> <del>which the license is acquired. Each period is one year beginning on</del> <u>September 1 or another date set by the commission</u>].

7 SECTION 42. Section 42.012(c), Parks and Wildlife Code, is 8 repealed.

9 SECTION 43. The changes in law made by this Act apply only 10 to a license, stamp, tag, or permit issued by the Parks and Wildlife 11 Department on or after September 1, 2006.

12 SECTION 44. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
