4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:	
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 466, Government Code, is	
6	amended by adding Section 466.257 to read as follows:	
7	Sec. 466.257. LOTTERY CONDUCTED BY STATE UNIVERSITY. (a)	
8	In this section, "general academic teaching institution" has the	
9	meaning assigned by Section 61.003, Education Code.	
10	(b) A general academic teaching institution may operate a	
11	one-time lottery for the purposes of raising revenue to support the	
12	institution and awarding one or more motor vehicles as prizes. A	
13	lottery conducted under this section is a state lottery authorized	
14	by Section 47(e), Article III, Texas Constitution. Except as	
15	otherwise provided by this section, the other provisions of this	
16	chapter applicable to a lottery game conducted by the commission	
17	apply to a lottery conducted under this section.	
18	(c) Notwithstanding the other provisions of this chapter,	
19	the governing board of a general academic teaching institution	
20	operating a lottery under this section may:	
21	(1) accept the donation of a motor vehicle for a prize	
22	to be awarded;	
23	(2) set the price of each ticket;	
24	(3) determine the number and types of locations at	

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which a ticket may be sold;

2 (4) establish the method to be used in selling a 3 <u>ticket;</u>

4 (5) determine the means of advertising to be used for 5 the lottery; and

6 (6) prescribe the time and place at which the winning
7 tickets in the lottery will be selected.

8 (d) The commission shall provide technical assistance to a 9 general academic teaching institution operating a lottery under 10 this section so that activities conducted by the institution comply 11 with the applicable requirements of this chapter.

12 (e) All revenue received from the sale of lottery tickets 13 under this section shall be retained by the institution conducting 14 the lottery, other than amounts the governing board pays to the 15 commission or another person for services provided in connection 16 with the lottery. The revenue retained by the institution shall be 17 treated as institutional funds of the institution and may be used 18 for any public purpose of the institution.

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(f) This section expires September 1, 2006.

20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
