A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
2	relating to restrictions on the transfer of a fuel tank to a metal
3	recycling entity.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1956.103, Occupations Code, is amended
6	by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
7	(c) Subsection (a) does not apply to a fuel tank that has
8	been completely drained and rendered unusable in accordance with
9	<u>Texas Commission on Environmental Quality rules regardless of</u>
10	whether the fuel tank is attached to a motor vehicle.
11	SECTION 2. Section 1956.104, Occupations Code, is amended
12	to read as follows:
13	Sec. 1956.104. NOTICE OF RESTRICTIONS. A metal recycling
14	entity shall post in a conspicuous location a notice that:
15	(1) is readily visible to a person selling material to
16	the metal recycling entity;
17	(2) is at least 24 inches horizontally by 18 inches
18	vertically; and
19	(3) contains the following language:
20	TEXAS LAW PROHIBITS:
21	1. THE SALE OF A WHOLE, FLATTENED, OR JUNKED MOTOR VEHICLE,
22	AN APPLIANCE, OR ANY OTHER SCRAP METAL ITEM CONTAINING A LEAD-ACID
23	BATTERY, FUEL TANK <u>THAT HAS NOT BEEN COMPLETELY DRAINED AND</u>
24	RENDERED UNUSABLE, OR PCB-CONTAINING CAPACITOR; AND

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2. THE SALE OF LEAD-ACID BATTERIES, FUEL TANKS <u>THAT HAVE NOT</u>
<u>BEEN COMPLETELY DRAINED AND RENDERED UNUSABLE</u>, OR PCB-CONTAINING
CAPACITORS INCLUDED WITH OTHER SCRAP METALS WITHOUT OUR PRIOR
WRITTEN ACKNOWLEDGMENT.

VIOLATION OF THIS LAW IS A MISDEMEANOR.

6 SECTION 3. (a) The Texas Commission on Environmental 7 Quality shall adopt standards required under Subsection (c), 8 Section 1956.103, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, defining 9 fuel tanks that are completely drained and unusable not later than 10 December 1, 2005.

(b) The change in law made by this Act applies only to the sale or transfer of a fuel tank to a metal recycling entity on or after January 1, 2006. A fuel tank sold or transferred before that date is subject to the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
