A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the Interagency Council for Genetic Services and the
- 3 provision of genetic counseling services.
- Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Subsections (b) and (c), Section 134.001, Human 5
- 6 Resources Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The council consists of:
- (1) a representative of the $[{\tt Texas}]$ Department of 8
- Aging and Disability Services [Mental Health and Mental 9
- Retardation], appointed by the commissioner of that department 10
- [mental health and mental retardation]; 11
- 12 (2) a representative of the [Texas] Department of
- 13 State Health Services, appointed by the commissioner of that
- 14 department [health];
- 15 (3) a representative of the Texas Department of
- Insurance, appointed by the commissioner of insurance; 16
- a representative of The University of Texas health 17
- science centers, appointed by the chancellor of The University of 18
- Texas System; 19

- (5) a representative of the public and private 20
- entities that contract with the [Texas] Department of State Health 21
- 22 Services to provide genetic services, elected from their
- 23 membership; and
- (6) two consumers of genetic services, family members 24

- of consumers of genetic services, or representatives of consumer
- 2 groups related to the provision of genetic services, appointed by
- 3 the governor.
- 4 (c) The members provided for by Subdivisions (5) and (6) of
- 5 Subsection (b) [of this section] serve two-year terms and may be
- 6 reappointed or reelected for subsequent terms. A representative of
- 7 the [Texas] Department of Aging and Disability Services, [Mental
- 8 Health and Mental Retardation, Texas] Department of State Health
- 9 Services, Texas Department of Insurance, or The University of Texas
- 10 health science centers serves at the pleasure of the appropriate
- 11 [his respective] commissioner or chancellor or until termination of
- 12 <u>the person's</u> [his] employment with the <u>represented</u> entity [he
- 13 represents].
- 14 SECTION 2. Subsection (b), Section 134.003, Human Resources
- 15 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 16 (b) The [Texas] Department of State Health Services,
- 17 [Texas] Department of Aging and Disability Services [Mental Health
- 18 and Mental Retardation], Texas Department of Insurance, and The
- 19 University of Texas health science centers shall share the cost of
- 20 providing clerical and advisory support staff to the council.
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 134.004, Human Resources Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 134.004. DUTIES. The council shall:
- 24 (1) survey current resources for human genetic
- 25 services in the state;
- 26 (2) initiate a scientific evaluation of the current
- 27 and future needs for the services;

- 1 (3) develop a comparable data base among providers
- 2 that will permit the evaluation of cost-effectiveness and the value
- 3 of different human genetic services and methods of service
- 4 delivery;
- 5 (4) promote a common statewide data base to study the
- 6 epidemiology of human genetic disorders;
- 7 (5) assist in coordinating statewide human genetic
- 8 services for all state residents;
- 9 (6) increase the flow of information among separate
- 10 providers and appropriation authorities and develop recommended
- 11 contract terms that address the provision of and payment for the use
- of human genetic services to cure disease under publicly funded
- 13 programs for the provision of health care;
- 14 (7) develop guidelines to monitor the provision of
- 15 human genetic services, including laboratory testing;
- 16 (8) identify state entities that serve persons who are
- 17 affected by or who are at risk of having children who are affected
- 18 by environmental genetic disorders and coordinate activities with
- 19 those agencies; [and]
- 20 (9) develop strategies, including the use of
- 21 telemedicine and genetic counselors, to increase the availability
- of genetic services in rural and underserved areas of the state;
- 23 (10) coordinate and expand education to the public,
- 24 health care providers, medical students, child-care workers, and
- 25 school personnel regarding human genetic services and genetic
- 26 disorders;
- 27 (11) address language and cultural barriers that

- 1 affect the council's mission and train providers in cultural
- 2 <u>competency;</u>
- 3 (12) address the trend to transfer costs for providing
- 4 genetic services to a clinical geneticist or the clinical
- 5 geneticist's employer;
- 6 (13) develop recruitment strategies and educational
- 7 programs to attract diversity in genetic services clinics; and
- 8 <u>(14)</u> work in coordination with the state agencies
- 9 named in Sections 134.001(b)(1), (2), and (3) when the agency
- 10 initiates, considers, or proposes a rule relating to human genetics
- 11 or human genetic services.
- 12 SECTION 4. Section 134.005, Human Resources Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 134.005. USE OF FUNDS. (a) The council may receive
- any appropriation, donation, contribution, or other funds from the
- state or federal government or any other public or private source to
- 17 perform its duties under this chapter [Act]. The [Texas]
- 18 Department of State Health Services shall accept the funds on
- 19 behalf of the council and shall deposit any funds accepted under
- 20 this subsection to the credit of a special account in the General
- 21 Revenue Fund. The department may retain a percentage of any funds
- 22 accepted on behalf of the council to cover its costs in
- 23 administering this subsection. The percentage retained by the
- department shall be set at a level agreeable to the council.
- 25 (b) If the [Texas] Department of State Health Services,
- 26 [Texas] Department of Aging and Disability Services [Mental Health
- 27 and Mental Retardation], Texas Department of Insurance, or The

- 1 University of Texas health science centers receive federal funds to
- 2 be used only to coordinate and plan statewide genetic services, the
- 3 department or system shall transfer the funds to the council
- 4 through the [Texas] Department of State Health Services to be used
- 5 for the purposes for which the funds were received.
- 6 (c) The council shall adopt and employ policies and methods
- 7 of financial management which are acceptable to the [Texas]
- 8 Department of <u>State</u> Health <u>Services</u>.
- 9 (d) The [Texas] Department of State Health Services may
- 10 expend funds received on behalf of the council under this section
- 11 for the purposes of this chapter [Act], in accordance with the
- 12 recommendations from the council.
- 13 SECTION 5. Section 134.006, Human Resources Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 134.006. ANNUAL REPORTS. The council shall annually
- 16 submit a progress report to the <u>executive commissioner of the</u>
- 17 Health and Human Services Commission, to the commissioners [boards]
- of the [Texas] Department of State Health Services and the [Texas]
- 19 Department of Aging and Disability Services [Mental Health and
- 20 Mental Retardation], to the commissioner of insurance [the Texas
- 21 Department of Insurance], and to the board of regents of The
- 22 University of Texas System.
- 23 SECTION 6. Chapter 134, Human Resources Code, is amended by
- 24 adding Sections 134.007, 134.008, and 134.009 to read as follows:
- Sec. 134.007. TASK FORCE. (a) The commissioner of state
- 26 health services shall appoint a task force to study best practices
- 27 for educating medical students and local health care providers on

- 1 genetic issues and providing for their participation in genetic
- 2 <u>services clinics.</u>
- 3 (b) Members of the task force are not entitled to
- 4 compensation, per diem, or expense reimbursement for their service
- 5 on the task force.
- 6 Sec. 134.008. ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON LICENSING. (a) The
- 7 commissioner of state health services shall establish an advisory
- 8 committee on the licensing of genetic counselors.
- 9 (b) The advisory committee shall be composed of members
- 10 appointed by the commissioner of state health services from the
- 11 public and private sectors, including:
- 12 (1) representatives from the agencies included in the
- 13 council;
- 14 (2) a Department of State Health Services employee who
- 15 performs functions relating to licensing; and
- 16 (3) a representative of the public.
- 17 (c) The Department of State Health Services shall provide
- 18 staff necessary for the advisory committee.
- 19 (d) The advisory committee shall make recommendations to
- 20 the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services
- 21 Commission with respect to the creation of licensing standards for
- 22 genetic counselors.
- (e) Section 2110.008, Government Code, does not apply to the
- 24 advisory committee.
- Sec. 134.009. LICENSING OF GENETIC COUNSELORS. (a) A
- 26 person may not act as a genetic counselor if the person does not
- 27 hold a license issued in accordance with rules adopted under this

- 1 <u>section</u>.
- 2 (b) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 3 Services Commission shall adopt rules governing the license
- 4 requirements for genetic counselors, including rules relating to:
- 5 (1) the term of the license;
- 6 (2) a fee for the license and renewal of the license,
- 7 which must be set in amounts necessary to defray the costs of
- 8 administering the licensing program;
- 9 <u>(3)</u> renewal of the license; and
- 10 (4) training or educational requirements for license
- 11 holders that ensure that genetic counselors meet minimum standards
- 12 for competency as necessary to protect the health and safety of
- 13 residents of this state.
- (c) In adopting rules under Subsection (b), the executive
- 15 commissioner shall consider the recommendations of the advisory
- 16 committee established under Section 134.008.
- 17 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
