## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to performance standards for gifted and talented programs

3 in public schools.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 29, Education Code, is

6 amended by adding Section 29.124 to read as follows:

- 7 Sec. 29.124. PERFORMANCE STANDARDS; STATE FUNDING. (a)
- 8 The commissioner shall adopt the performance standards developed by
- 9 the agency under the pilot project required by Rider 52, page
- 10 III-17, Chapter 1330, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular
- 11 Session, 2003 (the General Appropriations Act), for assessing the
- 12 performance in English language arts, mathematics, science, and
- 13 social studies of students in a program for gifted and talented
- 14 students. The commissioner may adopt performance standards for
- 15 assessing the performance in other subjects or at other grade
- 16 levels of students in a program for gifted and talented students.
- 17 The commissioner shall establish the minimum level of student
- 18 performance necessary to comply with the performance standards and
- 19 may periodically raise the minimum level as the commissioner
- 20 <u>determines necessary.</u>
- 21 (b) A school district is not required to use the performance
- 22 <u>standards adopted under Subsection (a).</u>
- (c) From funds appropriated for that purpose, for each
- 24 student who meets the minimum level of performance on the

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- 1 performance standards adopted under Subsection (a), a school
- 2 district is entitled to \$100. A school district must use funds
- 3 received under this subsection in providing a program for gifted
- 4 and talented students under this subchapter. The amount
- 5 appropriated for any fiscal year for purposes of this subsection
- 6 may not exceed \$6 million.
- 7 (d) The commissioner may adopt rules necessary to
- 8 administer this section.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2005-2006
- 10 school year.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
