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S.B. No. 1399

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the portion of designated tuition required to be set 3 aside to provide student financial assistance at institutions of 4 higher education.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Section 56.011(a), Education Code, is amended to
read as follows:

8 (a) The governing board of each institution of higher 9 education shall cause to be set aside not less than 20 percent of 10 any amount of tuition charged to a resident undergraduate student 11 under Section 54.0513 in excess of \$46 per semester credit hour. 12 The funds set aside under this section by an institution shall be 13 used to provide <u>need-based</u> financial assistance for resident 14 undergraduate students enrolled in the institution.

15 SECTION 2. Section 56.012(a), Education Code, is amended to 16 read as follows:

The governing board of each institution of higher 17 (a) education shall cause to be set aside not less than 15 percent of 18 any amount of tuition charged to a resident student enrolled in a 19 graduate or professional degree program under Section 54.0513 in 20 21 excess of \$46 per semester credit hour. The funds set aside under 22 this section by an institution shall be used to provide need-based 23 financial assistance for resident students enrolled in graduate and 24 professional degree programs at the institution.

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S.B. No. 1399 SECTION 3. Section 56.465(a), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

3 (a) The governing board of each institution of higher 4 education shall cause to be set aside five percent of the amount of 5 the tuition charged to a resident undergraduate student at the 6 institution under Section 54.0513 in excess of \$46 per semester 7 credit hour. The amount of a student's tuition set aside under this 8 subsection is <u>in addition to</u> [considered a part of] the amount 9 required to be set aside from that tuition under Section 56.011.

SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to financial aid awarded for a semester or term that begins on or after the effective date of this Act, and do not affect a student's right to receive financial aid awarded before the effective date of this Act for any part of the 2005-2006 academic year.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
