2	relating to prohibiting the use of remote control locomotives to
3	carry hazardous materials; providing penalties.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Title 112, Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by adding Article 6448c to read as follows:
7	Art. 6448c. OPERATION OF REMOTE CONTROL LOCOMOTIVES.
8	(a) For purposes of this subsection:
9	(1) the term "hazardous material" has the meaning
10	given that term in 49 USC Section 5102(2);
11	(2) the term "railroad carrier" has the meaning given
12	that term in 49 USC Section 20102;
13	(3) the term "remote control locomotive" means a
14	locomotive which, through use of a radio transmitter and receiver
15	system, can be operated by a person not physically located at the
16	controls within the confines of the locomotive cab, but does not
17	include a locomotive that is remotely controlled from the lead
18	locomotive of the same train; and
19	(4) The term "remote control transmitter" means the
20	transmitter component of a remote control locomotive system.
21	(b) A railroad carrier may not operate or cause to be
22	operated on the general system of railroad transportation a remote

control locomotive to carry hazardous materials.

(c) A railroad carrier acts knowingly when:

- 1 (1) the railroad carrier has actual knowledge of the
- 2 facts giving rise to a violation; or
- 3 (2) a reasonable railroad carrier acting in the
- 4 circumstances and exercising reasonable care would have that
- 5 knowledge.
- 6 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2006, the Railroad
- 7 Commission of Texas shall adopt rules relating to the operation of
- 8 remote control locomotives as required by Article 6448c, Revised
- 9 Statutes, as added by this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
