4	SECTION 1. Subdivision (6), Section 1071.002, Occupations

6	(6) "Professional surveying" means the practice of
7	land, boundary, or property surveying or other similar professional
8	practices. The term includes:
9	(A) performing any service or work the adequate
10	performance of which involves applying special knowledge of the
11	principles of geodesy, mathematics, related applied and physical
12	sciences, and relevant laws to the measurement or location of
13	sites, points, lines, angles, elevations, natural features, and
14	existing man-made works in the air, on the earth's surface, within
15	underground workings, and on the beds of bodies of water to
16	determine areas and volumes for:
17	(i) locating real property boundaries;
18	(ii) platting and laying out land and

- 4 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
