A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the provision of education and training programs for
3	law enforcement officers regarding persons with mental
4	impairments.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the "Bob Meadours
7	Act."
8	SECTION 2. Section 96.641, Education Code, is amended by
9	adding Subsection (1) to read as follows:
10	(1) As part of the initial training and continuing education
11	for police chiefs required under this section, the institute shall
12	establish a program on de-escalation and crisis intervention
13	techniques to facilitate interaction with persons with mental
14	impairments. The program must include an examination of the best
15	practices for:
16	(1) monitoring peace officers' compliance with
17	internal agency policies relating to de-escalation and crisis
18	intervention techniques to facilitate interaction with persons
19	with mental impairments; and
20	(2) implementing internal agency policies relating to
21	those techniques.
22	SECTION 3. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended
23	by adding Subsection (j) to read as follows:
24	(j) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the

commission shall require an officer to complete a statewide education and training program on de-escalation and crisis intervention techniques to facilitate interaction with persons with mental impairments. An officer shall complete the program not later than the second anniversary of the date the officer is licensed under this chapter or the date the officer applies for an intermediate proficiency certificate, whichever date is earlier.

8 SECTION 4. Section 1701.402, Occupations Code, is amended 9 by adding Subsection (g) to read as follows:

10 (g) As a requirement for an intermediate proficiency 11 certificate or an advanced proficiency certificate, an officer must 12 complete the education and training program described by Section 13 <u>1701.253</u> regarding de-escalation and crisis intervention 14 <u>techniques to facilitate interaction with persons with mental</u> 15 <u>impairments.</u>

16 SECTION 5. Not later than January 1, 2006, the Bill 17 Blackwood Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas shall 18 establish a program on de-escalation and crisis intervention 19 techniques to facilitate interaction with persons with mental 20 impairments as required by Subsection (1), Section 96.641, 21 Education Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 6. (a) An individual appointed or elected as a police chief before the effective date of this Act shall complete a program on de-escalation and crisis intervention techniques to facilitate interaction with persons with mental impairments established under Subsection (1), Section 96.641, Education Code, as added by this Act, not later than September 1, 2007.

1 (b) A person who, on September 1, 2005, holds an 2 intermediate proficiency certificate or an advanced proficiency certificate issued under Section 1701.402, Occupations Code, or has 3 held a peace officer license issued by the Commission on Law 4 5 Enforcement Officer Standards and Education for more than two years shall complete an educational training program on de-escalation and 6 7 crisis intervention techniques to facilitate interaction with persons with mental impairments as required by Sections 1701.253 8 and 1701.402, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, not later 9 10 than September 1, 2007.

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SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
