A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the provision of education and training programs for
- 3 law enforcement officers regarding persons with mental
- 4 impairments.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the "Bob Meadours
- 7 Act."
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 96.641, Education Code, is amended by
- 9 adding Subsections (1) and (m) to read as follows:
- 10 (1) As part of the initial training and continuing education
- 11 for police chiefs required under this section, the institute shall
- 12 establish a program on de-escalation and crisis intervention
- 13 techniques to facilitate interaction with persons with mental
- 14 impairments. The program must include an examination of the best
- 15 practices for:
- 16 (1) monitoring peace officers' compliance with
- 17 <u>internal agency policies relating to de-escalation and crisis</u>
- 18 <u>intervention techniques to facilitate interaction with persons</u>
- 19 with mental impairments; and
- 20 (2) implementing internal agency policies relating to
- 21 those techniques.
- 22 (m) A police chief may not satisfy the requirements of
- 23 Subsection (1) by taking an online course on de-escalation and
- 24 crisis intervention techniques to facilitate interaction with

- 1 persons with mental impairments.
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended
- 3 by adding Subsection (j) to read as follows:
- 4 (j) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the
- 5 commission shall require an officer to complete a statewide
- 6 education and training program on de-escalation and crisis
- 7 intervention techniques to facilitate interaction with persons
- 8 with mental impairments. An officer shall complete the program not
- 9 later than the second anniversary of the date the officer is
- 10 licensed under this chapter or the date the officer applies for an
- 11 <u>intermediate proficiency certificate</u>, whichever date is earlier.
- 12 An officer may not satisfy the requirements of this section or
- 13 Section 1701.402(g) by taking an online course on de-escalation and
- 14 crisis intervention techniques to facilitate interaction with
- 15 persons with mental impairments.
- SECTION 4. Section 1701.402, Occupations Code, is amended
- 17 by adding Subsection (g) to read as follows:
- 18 (g) As a requirement for an intermediate proficiency
- 19 certificate or an advanced proficiency certificate, an officer must
- 20 complete the education and training program described by Section
- 21 1701.253 regarding de-escalation and crisis intervention
- 22 <u>techniques to facilitate interaction with persons with mental</u>
- 23 impairments.
- SECTION 5. Not later than January 1, 2006, the Bill
- 25 Blackwood Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas shall
- 26 establish a program on de-escalation and crisis intervention
- 27 techniques to facilitate interaction with persons with mental

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- 1 impairments as required by Subsection (1), Section 96.641,
- 2 Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 3 SECTION 6. (a) An individual appointed or elected as a
- 4 police chief before the effective date of this Act shall complete a
- 5 program on de-escalation and crisis intervention techniques to
- 6 facilitate interaction with persons with mental impairments
- 7 established under Subsection (1), Section 96.641, Education Code,
- 8 as added by this Act, not later than September 1, 2009.
- 9 (b) A person who, on September 1, 2005, holds an
- 10 intermediate proficiency certificate or an advanced proficiency
- 11 certificate issued under Section 1701.402, Occupations Code, or has
- 12 held a peace officer license issued by the Commission on Law
- 13 Enforcement Officer Standards and Education for more than two years
- shall complete an educational training program on de-escalation and
- 15 crisis intervention techniques to facilitate interaction with
- 16 persons with mental impairments as required by Sections 1701.253
- and 1701.402, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, not later
- 18 than September 1, 2009.
- 19 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
