A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to contracts between hospitals and preferred provider

3 benefit plan issuers.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 1301, Insurance Code, as

6 effective April 1, 2005, is amended by adding Section 1301.202 to

7 read as follows:

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- 8 Sec. 1301.202. CONTRACTS WITH HOSPITALS. (a) An insurer
- 9 that contracts with hospitals to provide services to insureds under
- 10 <u>a preferred provider benefit plan may not deny a hospital the</u>
- 11 opportunity to participate in providing health care services as a
- 12 preferred provider solely because the hospital is not accredited by
- 13 <u>the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations</u>
- or another specified national accrediting body. If a hospital is
- 15 <u>certified</u> by the Medicare program, <u>Title XVIII</u> of the Social
- 16 Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section 1395 et seq.), or accredited by the
- 17 Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations or
- 18 <u>another national accrediting body</u>, an insurer shall accept that
- 19 <u>certification or accreditation.</u>
- 20 (b) This section does not limit an insurer's authority to
- 21 establish other reasonable terms under which a hospital may provide
- 22 health care services to individuals covered by a preferred provider
- 23 benefit plan.
- 24 (c) On the request of a hospital, the commissioner shall

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- 1 conduct an investigation, review, hearing, or other proceeding to
- 2 determine whether an insurer is complying with this section.
- 3 (d) The commissioner shall take reasonable action to ensure
- 4 compliance with this section, including issuing orders and imposing
- 5 sanctions.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
