BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 7 SECTION 1. Section 521.126, Transportation Code, is amended 8 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (g) and (h) to 9 read as follows: 10 11 (b) Except as provided by Subsections [Subsection] (d), 12 (e), and (g), a person commits an offense if the person: (1) accesses or uses electronically readable 13 14 information derived from a driver's license, commercial driver's license, or personal identification certificate; or 15 compiles or maintains a database of electronically 16 (2) readable information derived from driver's licenses, commercial 17 18 driver's licenses, or personal identification certificates. (g) If authorized by the executive or administrative head of 19 a maritime facility as defined in the Maritime Transportation 20 21 Security Act of 2002 (46 U.S.C. Section 70101 et seq.), or of a port, port authority, or navigation district created or operating 22 23 under Section 52, Article III, or Section 59, Article XVI, Texas 24 Constitution, a person may access, use, compile, or maintain in a

S.B. No. 1556 database electronically readable information derived from a 1 2 driver's license, commercial driver's license, or personal identification certificate to secure the facility or port. The 3 information may be used only to: 4 5 identify an individual; 6 (2) provide official credentials for an individual; 7 (3) track or limit the movement of an individual on 8 facility property; 9 (4) establish a secure database of visitors to the 10 facility; (5) access the information at terminal and gate 11 12 operations of the facility; or (6) conduct other security or operational activities 13 14 as determined by the executive or administrative head. 15 (h) Except as provided by Section 418.183, Government Code, the electronically readable information derived from a driver's 16 17 license, commercial driver's license, or personal identification certificate for the purposes of Subsection (g) is confidential and 18 not subject to disclosure, inspection, or copying under Chapter 19 552, Government Code. 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 23 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

25 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
