A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the amount of longevity and hazardous duty pay for 3 certain state employees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subsections (a) through (d), Section 659.044,
- 6 Government Code, as amended by Section 32, Chapter 1158, Acts of the
- 7 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, and Section 104, Chapter
- 8 1158, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, are
- 9 reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 10 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (e), the monthly amount
- of longevity pay is \$20 for every two [three] years of lifetime
- 12 service credit.
- 13 (b) The amount increases when the 4th, 6th, 8th [9th], 10th,
- 14 12th, 14th [15th], 16th, 18th, 20th [21st], 22nd, 24th, 26th
- 15 [27th], 28th, 30th, 32nd [33rd], 34th, 36th, 38th [39th], 40th, and
- 16 42nd years of lifetime service credit are accrued.
- 17 (c) An increase is effective beginning with the month
- following the month in which the 4th, 6th, 8th [9th], 10th, 12th,
- 19 <u>14th</u> [15th], <u>16th</u>, 18th, <u>20th</u> [21st], <u>22nd</u>, 24th, <u>26th</u> [27th],
- 20 28th, 30th, 32nd [33rd], 34th, 36th, 38th [39th], 40th, and 42nd
- 21 years of lifetime service credit are accrued.
- 22 (d) An employee may not receive from the state as longevity
- 23 pay more than the amount determined under Subsection (a) or (e), as
- 24 applicable, regardless of the number of positions the employee

- 1 holds or the number of hours the employee works each week.
- 2 SECTION 2. Subsections (a), (b), (c), and (g), Section
- 3 659.305, Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 4 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), the amount of a
- 5 full-time state employee's hazardous duty pay for a particular
- 6 month is the lesser of:
- 7 (1) $\frac{\$10}{\$7}$ for each 12-month period of lifetime
- 8 service credit accrued by the employee; or
- 9 (2) $\$300 \ [\$210]$.
- 10 (b) This subsection applies only to a state employee whose
- 11 compensation for services provided to the state during any month
- 12 before August 1987 included hazardous duty pay that was based on
- total state service performed before May 29, 1987. The amount of a
- 14 full-time state employee's hazardous duty pay for a particular
- month is the sum of:
- 16 (1) $\frac{$10}{$}$ [\$7] for each 12-month period of state service
- 17 credit the employee finished accruing before May 29, 1987; and
- 18 (2) \$10 [\$7] for each 12-month period of lifetime
- 19 service credit that the employee accrued after the date, which must
- 20 be before May 29, 1987, on which the employee finished accruing the
- 21 last 12-month period of state service credit.
- (c) The amount determined under Subsection (b)(2) may not
- 23 exceed \$300 [\$210].
- (g) A state employee may not receive more than \$10\$ [\$7] for
- 25 each 12-month period of lifetime service credit, regardless of:
- 26 (1) the number of positions the employee holds; or
- 27 (2) the number of hours the employee works each week.
