Sections 659.044(a)-(d), Government Code, 5 as 6 amended by Section 32, Chapter 1158, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, and Section 104, Chapter 1158, Acts of the 7 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, are reenacted and amended 8 to read as follows: 9 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (e), the monthly amount 10 11 of longevity pay is \$20 for every two [three] years of lifetime 12 service credit. 13 (b) The amount increases when the <u>4th</u>, 6th, <u>8th</u> [9th], <u>10th</u>, 12th, 14th [15th], 16th, 18th, 20th [21st], 22nd, 24th, 26th 14 [27th], 28th, 30th, 32nd [33rd], 34th, 36th, 38th [39th], 40th, and 15 42nd years of lifetime service credit are accrued. 16 (c) An increase is effective beginning with the month 17 18 following the month in which the 4th, 6th, 8th [9th], 10th, 12th, 14th [15th], 16th, 18th, 20th [21st], 22nd, 24th, 26th [27th], 19 <u>28th,</u> 30th, <u>32nd</u> [33rd], <u>34th,</u> 36th, <u>38th</u> [39th], <u>40th,</u> 20 and 42nd years of lifetime service credit are accrued. 21 22 (d) An employee may not receive from the state as longevity

2 SECTION 2. Sections 659.305(a), (b), (c), and (g),
3 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:

4 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), the amount of a
5 full-time state employee's hazardous duty pay for a particular
6 month is the lesser of:

7 (1) <u>\$10</u> [\$7] for each 12-month period of lifetime
8 service credit accrued by the employee; or

(2) <u>\$300</u> [\$210].

10 (b) This subsection applies only to a state employee whose 11 compensation for services provided to the state during any month 12 before August 1987 included hazardous duty pay that was based on 13 total state service performed before May 29, 1987. The amount of a 14 full-time state employee's hazardous duty pay for a particular 15 month is the sum of:

(1) \$10 [\$7] for each 12-month period of state service
 credit the employee finished accruing before May 29, 1987; and

(2) <u>\$10</u> [\$7] for each 12-month period of lifetime
service credit that the employee accrued after the date, which must
be before May 29, 1987, on which the employee finished accruing the
last 12-month period of state service credit.

(c) The amount determined under Subsection (b)(2) may not
exceed <u>\$300</u> [\$210].

(g) A state employee may not receive more than \$10 [\$7] for
each 12-month period of lifetime service credit, regardless of:
(1) the number of positions the employee holds; or
(2) the number of hours the employee works each week.

1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
