A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the creation of a study commission on transportation

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 162, Tax Code, is amended
6	by adding Section 162.017 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 162.017. STUDY COMMISSION ON TRANSPORTATION
8	FINANCING. (a) The Study Commission on Transportation Financing
9	is created as provided by this section.
10	(b) The commission is composed of nine members as follows:
11	(1) three members of the general public appointed by
12	the governor;
13	(2) three members appointed by the lieutenant
14	governor, of which one is a member of the general public and two are
15	members of the senate; and
16	(3) three members appointed by the speaker of the
17	house of representatives, of which one is a member of the general
18	public and two are members of the house.
19	(c) Each member of the commission serves at the will of the
20	person who appointed the member.
21	(d) The lieutenant governor shall designate one of the
22	appointed senators and the speaker of the house of representatives
23	shall designate one of the appointed house members to serve
24	together as joint presiding officers of the commission.

1	(e) A member of the commission is not entitled to receive
2	compensation for service on the commission but is entitled to
3	reimbursement of the travel expenses incurred by the member while
4	conducting the business of the commission, as provided by the
5	General Appropriations Act.
6	(f) The commission may accept gifts and grants from any
7	source to be used to carry out a function of the commission.
8	(g) The commission shall conduct public hearings and study
9	public policy implications relating to the financing of
10	transportation projects.
11	(h) The study shall include:
12	(1) a review of the state motor fuels tax in order to:
13	(A) evaluate the state motor fuels tax, including
14	its efficacy in funding the transportation needs of this state; and
15	(B) examine and evaluate the expenditure of funds
16	from the state highway fund;
17	(2) a review of the current sources for funding rail
18	transportation projects in order to:
19	(A) evaluate the options for rail funding,
20	including their efficacy in funding identified rail needs of the
21	state; and
22	(B) identify other possible sources for funding;

24	(3) a review of all other financing options for all
25	modes of transportation, including but not limited to:
26	(A) motor vehicle user fees and fines;
