- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Sections 28.025(c) and (d), Education Code, are 4 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 A person may receive a diploma if the person is eligible for a diploma under Section 28.0251. In other cases, a student may 7
- (1) the student successfully completes the curriculum 9 requirements identified by the State Board of Education under 10 11 Subsection (a) and:
- 12 (A) complies with Section 39.025(a); or
- 13 (B) meets the alternative graduation criteria 14 prescribed under Section 28.0252; or
- 15 (2) the student successfully completes an individualized education program developed under Section 29.005. 16
 - (d) A school district may issue a certificate of coursework completion to a student who successfully completes the curriculum requirements identified by the State Board of Education under Subsection (a) but who fails to comply with Section 39.025(a) or the alternative graduation criteria under Section 28.0252. A school district may allow a student who receives a certificate to participate in a graduation ceremony with students receiving high school diplomas.

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- 1 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 28, Education Code, is 2 amended by adding Section 28.0252 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 28.0252. ALTERNATIVE GRADUATION CRITERIA. (a) The 4 commissioner by rule shall prescribe alternative graduation criteria that a student may meet to graduate and receive a diploma 5 6 without complying with Section 39.025(a). The alternative 7 graduation criteria must compensate for unsatifactory performance on the individual assessment instruments specified in Section 8 39.025(a). The alternative graduation criteria must include a 9 10 student's:
- 11 (1) grade point average beginning in grade 9;
- 12 (2) current class ranking;
- 13 (3) performance on the individual assessment

 14 instruments specified in Section 39.025(a), including a

 15 consideration of whether extenuating circumstances may have

 16 adversely affected the student's performance; and
- 17 (4) overall academic performance beginning in grade 9, 18 as evaluated by two or more of the student's teachers.
- (b) A committee composed of the student's high school 19 principal or the principal's designee and two certified teachers in 20 21 the student's school district who teach at the high school level shall determine whether a student who has not complied with Section 22 39.025(a) has met the alternative graduation criteria prescribed 23 24 under Subsection (a). The commissioner shall adopt rules relating 25 to the selection and operation of a committee under this 26 subsection.
- 27 (c) A committee established under Subsection (b) shall

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- 1 determine whether a student who has not complied with Section
- 2 39.025(a) has met the alternative graduation criteria prescribed
- 3 under Subsection (a):
- 4 (1) following the first administration to the student
- of the assessment instruments specified in Section 39.025(a);
- 6 (2) on written request of the student's parent or
- 7 guardian, not more than one time in each school year following the
- 8 school year in which the assessment instruments specified in
- 9 Section 39.025(a) are first administered to the student; and
- 10 (3) when the principal of the student's high school, or
- 11 the principal's designee, determines that the student is within one
- 12 month of completing each requirement for a high school diploma
- other than compliance with Section 39.025(a).
- 14 SECTION 3. (a) Section 28.025, Education Code, as amended
- by this Act, and Section 28.0252, Education Code, as added by this
- 16 Act, apply beginning with the 2006-2007 school year.
- 17 (b) Not later than June 1, 2006, the commissioner of
- 18 education shall adopt rules as required by Sections 28.0252(a) and
- 19 (b), Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
