5	SECTION 1. Sections 455.001(1), (2), (3), and (6),
6	Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:

17	(A) teaches at a minimum the course of
18	instruction required for <u>issuance of</u> [registration as] a massage
19	therapist <u>license or certificate of registration</u> ; and
20	(B) has at least two instructors.
21	SECTION 2. Section 455.003, Occupations Code, is amended to
22	read as follows:
23	Sec. 455.003. PRACTICES INCLUDED IN MASSAGE THERAPY.
24	Massage therapy includes the <u>application</u> [use] of <u>hydrotherapy or</u>

temperature for mechanical, thermal, or chemical effect and may 1 2 include oil, salt glows, heat lamps, hot and cold packs, and tub, 3 shower, or cabinet baths. 4 SECTION 3. Section 455.004, Occupations Code, is amended to 5 read as follows: 6 Sec. 455.004. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER. This chapter does not apply to: 7 8 (1)a person licensed in this state as a physician, 9 chiropractor, physical therapist, nurse, cosmetologist, or athletic trainer or as a member of a similar profession subject to 10 state licensing while the person is practicing within the scope of 11 the license; 12 (2) a school approved by the Texas Education Agency or 13 14 otherwise approved by the state; or 15 (3) an instructor otherwise approved by the state to teach in an area of study included in the required course of 16 17 instruction for issuance of [registration as] a massage therapist license or certificate of registration. 18 SECTION 4. 4 Sec. 455.053. RULES REGARDING MASSAGE SCHOOLS. Rules 5 adopted under this chapter relating to a massage school must 6 contain minimum standards for:

7 (1) the issuance, denial, renewal, suspension,
8 revocation, or probation of a certificate of registration under
9 this chapter;

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(2) the qualifications of professional personnel;

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(3) the supervision of professional personnel;

Sec. 455.054. RULES REGARDING MASSAGE THERAPISTS. Rules adopted under this chapter relating to a massage therapist must contain minimum standards for:

10 (1) the issuance, denial, renewal, suspension, 11 revocation, or probation of a <u>license or</u> certificate of 12 registration under this chapter;

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(2) the qualifications of a massage therapist;

14 (3) the sanitary and hygienic conditions of the 15 physical environment in which a massage therapist practices massage 16 therapy;

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(4) the records kept by a massage therapist;

(5) the inspection of the records, equipment, and sanitary and hygienic conditions of the physical environment used by a massage therapist in practicing massage therapy; and

27 Sec. 455.056. RULES REGARDING ADVERTISING OR COMPETITIVE

S.B. No. 1725 BIDDING BY LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE HOLDER [REGISTRANT]. (a) The 1 2 executive commissioner [board] may not adopt rules restricting advertising or competitive bidding by a person licensed or 3 registered under this chapter except to prohibit false, misleading, 4 5 or deceptive practices. 6 (b) In the [its] rules to prohibit false, misleading, or deceptive practices, the executive commissioner [board] may not 7 8 include a rule that: (1) restricts the use of any medium for advertising; 9 restricts the use of a <u>licensed or</u> registered 10 (2) person's personal appearance or voice in an advertisement; 11 relates to the 12 (3) size or duration of an advertisement by the licensed or registered person; or 13 (4) restricts the licensed or registered 14 person's 15 advertisement under a trade name. Sec. 455.057. CONTINUING EDUCATION. The department [board] 16 17 shall recognize, prepare, or administer continuing education programs for persons licensed or registered under this chapter. A 18 licensed or registered person must participate in the programs to 19 the extent required by the <u>department</u> [board] to keep the person's 20 21 license or certificate of registration. SECTION 7. Section 455.104, Occupations Code, is amended to 22 read as follows: 23 24 Sec. 455.104. INSPECTIONS; INVESTIGATIONS. The 25 department or its authorized representative may enter the premises 26 of an applicant for a license or certificate of registration or a license or certificate holder at: 27

(a) Unless the person is exempt from the <u>licensing or</u> registration requirement, a person may not act as a massage therapist, massage school, massage therapy instructor, or massage establishment unless the person holds an appropriate <u>license or</u> certificate of registration issued under this chapter.

(b) Unless the person is exempt from the <u>licensing or</u> registration requirement, a person may not represent that the person is:

21 <u>(1)</u> a <u>licensed</u> massage therapist unless the person 22 holds a <u>license under this chapter; or</u>

23 (2) a registered massage therapist unless the person
 24 <u>holds a</u> certificate of registration under this chapter.

25 Sec. 455.152. INELIGIBILITY FOR <u>LICENSE OR</u> REGISTRATION. 26 (a) A person is not eligible for <u>licensing or</u> registration as a 27 massage establishment, massage school, massage therapist, or

1 massage therapy instructor if the person is an individual and has 2 been convicted of, entered a plea of nolo contendere or guilty to, 3 or received deferred adjudication for an offense involving 4 prostitution or another sexual offense.

A person convicted of a violation of this chapter is 5 (b) 6 ineligible for <u>licensing or</u> registration as а massage 7 establishment, massage school, massage therapist, or massage 8 therapy instructor until the fifth anniversary of the date of the 9 conviction.

10Sec. 455.153. APPLICATION [FOR REGISTRATION]. An11applicant for licensing or registration under this chapter must:

12 (1) submit an application form provided by the 13 department; [and]

14 (2) include with the application the application fee15 set by the department; and

16 <u>(3) for a massage therapist applicant, submit proof</u> 17 <u>the applicant has successfully completed the requirements of</u> 18 <u>Section 455.1555 or 455.156</u>.

Sec. 455.154. GENERAL PROVISIONS RELATING TO <u>LICENSING AND</u> REGISTRATION. (a) The holder of a <u>license or</u> certificate of registration may exercise all professional rights, honors, and privileges relating to the practice of massage therapy.

(b) A <u>license or</u> certificate of registration is the property
of the department and must be surrendered on demand.

25 SECTION 10. Sections 455.155(b) and (c), Occupations Code, 26 are amended to read as follows:

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(b) A <u>licensed or</u> registered massage therapist who

1 practices as a solo practitioner is not required to register as a 2 massage establishment.

3 (c) The <u>executive commissioner</u> [board] by rule shall 4 provide for a fair and reasonable procedure to grant exemptions 5 from the <u>licensing or</u> registration requirements of this section. 6 The rules must provide that a person is exempt if the person shows 7 that the advertising or provision of massage therapy services is 8 incidental to the person's primary enterprise.

9 SECTION 11. Subchapter D, Chapter 455, Occupations Code, is 10 amended by adding Section 455.1555 to read as follows:

Sec. 455.1555. REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSED MASSAGE THERAPIST. (a) The department shall issue a massage therapist license to each qualified applicant.

14 (b) An applicant for licensing under this section must be an 15 <u>individual and:</u>

16 (1) present evidence satisfactory to the department
17 that the person:

18 <u>(A) has satisfactorily completed massage therapy</u> 19 studies in a supervised course of instruction of at least 500 hours 20 provided by a massage therapy instructor, a registered massage 21 school, a state-approved educational institution, or any 22 combination of instructors or schools, in which: 23 <u>(i) at least 200 hours are taught by a</u>

23 <u>(1) at least 200 hours are taught by a</u> 24 <u>massage therapy instructor and are dedicated to the study of</u> 25 <u>massage therapy techniques, theory, and practice and manipulation</u> 26 <u>of soft tissue by hand or through the use of a mechanical or</u> 27 <u>electrical apparatus, with at least 75 hours dedicated to Swedish</u>

1	massage techniques, and may include the study of Eastern techniques
2	and theory;
3	(ii) at least 165 hours are dedicated to
4	the study of anatomy, kinesiology, physiology, and pathology and
5	may include Eastern physiology;
6	(iii) at least 25 hours are dedicated to
7	the study of hydrotherapy;
8	(iv) at least 20 hours are dedicated to the
9	study of business practice standards;
10	(v) at least 10 hours are dedicated to the
11	study of professional ethics;
12	(vi) at least 20 hours are dedicated to the
13	study of health and hygiene;
14	(vii) at least 40 hours are spent in an
15	internship program, provided that the hours spent in an internship
16	program may not exceed 15 percent of the total program hours; and
17	(viii) at least 20 hours are dedicated to
18	topics related to the massage profession; or
19	(B) has practiced massage therapy as a profession
20	for at least five years in another state or country that the
21	department determines does not maintain standards and requirements
22	of practice and licensing or registration that substantially

24	(2) pass the state-approved examination.
25	SECTION 12. Section 455.156, Occupations Code, is amended

S.B. No. 1725 MASSAGE THERAPIST. (a) The department shall issue a certificate of 1 2 registration to each qualified applicant for registration as a 3 registered massage [message] therapist. 4 An applicant for registration under this section must be (b) 5 an individual and: 6 (1) present evidence satisfactory to the department 7 [board] that the person: 8 (A) has satisfactorily completed massage therapy 9 studies in a 300-hour, supervised course of instruction provided by a massage therapy instructor, a registered massage school, a 10 state-approved educational institution, or any combination of 11 instructors or schools, in which: 12 125 hours are dedicated to the study of 13 (i) 14 Swedish massage therapy techniques and taught by a massage therapy 15 instructor; (ii) 50 hours are dedicated to the study of 16 17 anatomy; 25 hours are dedicated to the study of 18 (iii) 19 physiology; 20 (iv) 15 hours are dedicated to the study of 21 hydrotherapy; 22 (v) 15 hours are dedicated to the study of 23 business practices and professional ethics standards; 24 (vi) 20 hours are dedicated to the study of 25 health and hygiene; and 26 (vii) 50 hours are spent in an internship 27 program; or

1 (B) has practiced massage therapy as a profession 2 for not less than five years in another state or country that the 3 department determines does not maintain standards and requirements 4 of practice and licensing or registration that substantially 5 conform to the standards and requirements of this state; and

6 (2) pass the practical and written portions of the 7 state examination.

8 SECTION 13. Sections 455.1565(a) and (d), Occupations Code, 9 are amended to read as follows:

10 (a) Not later than the 30th day after the date a person takes 11 a <u>licensing or</u> registration examination under this chapter, the 12 department shall notify the person of the results of the 13 examination.

(d) If requested in writing by a person who fails a
<u>licensing or</u> registration examination administered under this
chapter, the department shall furnish the person with an analysis
of the person's performance on the examination.

SECTION 14. Sections 455.1571, 455.1572, and 455.158,
Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:

20 Sec. 455.1571. APPLICANT LICENSED OR REGISTERED IN ANOTHER JURISDICTION (a) 21 The department [board] may waive any prerequisite to obtaining a license or certificate of registration 22 for an applicant for <u>licensing or</u> registration as a massage 23 24 therapist or massage therapy instructor after reviewing the 25 applicant's credentials and determining that the applicant holds a license or certificate of registration issued by 26 another 27 jurisdiction that has licensing or registration requirements

1 substantially equivalent to those of this state.

2 The department [board] may waive any prerequisite to (b) obtaining a license or certificate of registration for an applicant 3 for licensing or registration as a massage therapist or massage 4 therapy instructor who holds a license or certificate of 5 registration issued by another jurisdiction with which this state 6 7 has a reciprocity agreement. The department [board] may make an 8 agreement, subject to the approval of the governor, with another state to allow for licensing or registration by reciprocity. 9

10 Sec. 455.1572. PROVISIONAL <u>LICENSE OR</u> REGISTRATION. (a) 11 The <u>department</u> [board] may issue a provisional <u>license or</u> 12 certificate of registration to an applicant for <u>licensing or</u> 13 registration as a massage therapist or massage therapy instructor 14 currently licensed or registered in another jurisdiction who seeks 15 a <u>license or</u> certificate of registration in this state and who:

has been licensed or registered in good standing 16 (1) 17 as а massage therapist or massage therapy instructor, as applicable, for at least two years in another jurisdiction, 18 19 including a foreign country, that has licensing or registration requirements substantially equivalent to the requirements of this 20 21 chapter;

(2) has passed a national or other examination recognized by the <u>department</u> [board] relating to the practice of massage therapy; and

(3) is sponsored by a person <u>licensed or</u> registered by
the <u>department</u> [board] under this chapter with whom the provisional
license or certificate holder [registrant] will practice during the

1 time the person holds a provisional <u>license or</u> certificate of 2 registration.

3 (b) The <u>department</u> [board] may waive the requirement of 4 Subsection (a)(3) for an applicant if the <u>department</u> [board] 5 determines that compliance with that subsection would be a hardship 6 to the applicant.

7 (c) A provisional <u>license or</u> certificate of registration is 8 valid until the date the <u>department</u> [board] approves or denies the 9 <u>license or</u> certificate holder's application for <u>licensing or</u> 10 registration. The <u>department</u> [board] shall issue a <u>license or</u> 11 certificate of registration under this chapter to the provisionally 12 <u>licensed or</u> registered person if the person:

13 (1) is eligible for a <u>license or</u> certificate of 14 registration under Section 455.1571; or

15 (2) passes the part of the examination under Section 16 455.101 that relates to the applicant's knowledge and understanding 17 of the laws and rules relating to the practice of massage therapy in 18 this state and:

(A) the <u>department</u> [board] verifies that the
 person meets the academic and experience requirements for <u>licensing</u>
 <u>or</u> registration under this chapter; and

(B) the person satisfies any other <u>licensing or</u>
 registration requirements under this chapter.

(d) The <u>department</u> [board] must approve or deny a
 provisionally <u>licensed or</u> registered person's application for a
 <u>license or</u> certificate of registration not later than the 180th day
 after the date the provisional license or certificate of

1 registration is issued. The <u>department</u> [board] may extend the 2 180-day period if the results of an examination have not been 3 received by the <u>department</u> [board] before the end of that period.

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4 (e) The <u>department</u> [board] may establish a fee for a
5 provisional <u>license or</u> certificate of registration in an amount
6 reasonable and necessary to cover the cost of issuing the <u>license or</u>
7 certificate of registration.

Sec. 455.158. STUDENT 8 EXEMPTION FROM LICENSING OR 9 REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS. A student who provides massage therapy 10 as part of an internship program or without compensation is exempt from <u>licensing or</u> registration under this chapter if the student is 11 enrolled in a state-approved course of instruction that consists of 12 at least 300 hours. 13

SECTION 15. Sections 455.159(a) and (b), Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:

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(a) An internship program must:

17 (1) meet the qualifications established by the 18 <u>department</u> [board];

19 (2) provide a student with a minimum of 40 hours of
 20 hands-on massage therapy experience; and

(3) be conducted on the school grounds or in a clinic or classroom setting provided by the massage school or massage therapy instructor.

(b) A student must complete <u>at least</u> [the first] 250 hours
of required training at a massage school or with a massage therapy
instructor <u>that provides to the student a written acknowledgment of</u>
<u>the student's successful completion of the required hours</u> before

1 the student is eligible to enter an internship program.

2 SECTION 16. Sections 455.160 and 455.161, Occupations Code, 3 are amended to read as follows:

4 Sec. 455.160. LICENSE OR REGISTRATION RENEWAL. (a) Δ 5 person licensed or registered under this chapter must periodically 6 renew the person's <u>license or</u> certificate of registration. The license or certificate expires unless the <u>license or</u> certificate 7 8 holder submits an application for renewal accompanied by the renewal fee prescribed by the department or by the late fee 9 10 prescribed by this section.

(b) The department shall adopt a system under which <u>licenses</u> or certificates of registration expire on various dates during the year. Fees must be prorated so that a <u>licensed or</u> registered person pays only for that part of the renewal period for which the <u>license</u> or registration is issued until the expiration date of the <u>license</u> or registration.

(c) A person who is otherwise eligible to renew a <u>license or</u> certificate of registration may renew an unexpired <u>license or</u> registration by paying the required renewal fee to the department before the expiration date of the <u>license or</u> registration. A person whose <u>license or</u> registration has expired may not engage in activities that require <u>a license or</u> registration until the <u>license</u> <u>or</u> registration has been renewed.

(d) A person whose <u>license or</u> registration has been expired
for 90 days or less may renew the <u>license or</u> registration by paying
to the department a renewal fee that is equal to 1-1/2 times the
normally required renewal fee.

1 (e) A person whose <u>license or</u> registration has been expired 2 for more than 90 days but less than one year may renew the <u>license or</u> 3 registration by paying to the department a renewal fee that is equal 4 to two times the normally required renewal fee.

5 (f) A person whose <u>license or</u> registration has been expired 6 for one year or more may not renew the <u>license or certificate of</u> 7 registration. The person may <u>obtain a license or certificate of</u> 8 <u>registration</u> [register] by complying with the requirements and 9 procedures, including the examination requirements, for originally 10 <u>licensing or</u> registering.

(g) Not later than the 30th day before the date a person's <u>license or certificate of</u> registration is scheduled to expire, the department shall send written notice of the impending expiration to the person at the person's last known address according to the records of the department.

Sec. 455.161. RENEWAL OF EXPIRED <u>LICENSE OR</u> REGISTRATION OF OUT-OF-STATE PRACTITIONER. (a) A person who was registered <u>or</u> <u>licensed</u> in this state, moved to another state, and is currently registered or licensed and has been in practice in the other state for the two years preceding the date of application may <u>obtain a</u> <u>certificate of registration or license</u> [register] without reexamination.

(b) The person must pay to the department a fee that is equal
to two times the normally required renewal fee for <u>a license or</u>
<u>certificate of</u> registration.

26 SECTION 17. Sections 455.201 and 455.202, Occupations Code, 27 are amended to read as follows:

Sec. 455.201. REFERRAL FROM PHYSICIAN. A person issued a
 <u>license or</u> certificate of registration may receive referrals from a
 physician to administer massage therapy.

Sec. 455.202. PRACTICE BY MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENT. A massage
establishment may employ only <u>licensed or</u> registered massage
therapists to perform massage therapy.

7 SECTION 18. Section 455.203(c), Occupations Code, is 8 amended to read as follows:

9 (c) A massage school or massage therapy instructor <u>licensed</u> 10 <u>or</u> registered under this chapter shall give each prospective 11 student a notice that clearly states the number of course hours that 12 the student must successfully complete before the student is 13 eligible to <u>obtain a license or certificate of registration</u> 14 [<u>register</u>] as a massage therapist under this chapter.

15 SECTION 19. Section 455.204, Occupations Code, is amended 16 to read as follows:

Sec. 455.204. DISPLAY OF <u>LICENSE OR</u> CERTIFICATE. (a) A person who holds a <u>license or</u> certificate of registration shall publicly display the <u>license or</u> certificate as specified by the department [board].

(b) Each massage establishment must post in plain sight the <u>license or</u> certificate of registration for each massage therapist who practices in the massage establishment.

(c) Each massage school, massage establishment, massage
 therapy instructor, or massage therapist shall present the person's
 <u>license or</u> certificate of registration on the request of the
 department, an authorized representative of the department, or a

1 peace officer.

2 SECTION 20. Sections 455.205(b), (c), and (d), Occupations
3 Code, are amended to read as follows:

(b) A massage school or a massage therapy instructor may not
<u>award a diploma or a certificate of completion to a student that has</u>
<u>not successfully completed at least</u> [require the successful
<u>completion of more course hours than</u>] the number of <u>course</u> hours
required for <u>licensing or</u> registration as a massage therapist under
this chapter.

10 (c) A person who is not <u>licensed or</u> registered under this 11 chapter may not use the word "massage" on any form of advertising 12 unless the person is expressly exempt from the <u>licensing or</u> 13 registration requirements of this chapter.

14 (d) A sexually oriented business may not use the <u>term</u> [word] 15 "massage <u>therapy</u>" or "massage therapist" on a sign or any form of 16 advertising.

For purposes of 13 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of 14 15 this Act if any element of the offense was committed before that 16 date.
