11	the United States or the Texas National Guard.
12	(b) For any academic term that begins after the date a
13	student described by Subsection (a) is released from active
14	military service but not later than the first anniversary of that
15	date, the institution of higher education from which the student
16	withdrew shall readmit the student, without requiring
17	reapplication or charging a fee for readmission, if the student is
18	otherwise eligible to register for classes at the institution. On
19	readmission of the student under this subsection, the institution
20	shall:
21	(1) provide to the student any financial assistance
22	previously provided by the institution to the student before the
23	student's withdrawal if the student meets current eligibility
24	requirements for the assistance, other than any requirement

directly affected by the student's service, such as continuous
enrollment or another similar timing requirement; and
(2) allow the student the same academic status that
the student had before the student's withdrawal, including any
course credit awarded to the student by the institution.
(c) An institution of higher education may adopt rules
requiring reasonable proof from a student of the fact and duration
of the student's active military service.
(b) Section 51.9242, Education Code, as added by this Act,
applies beginning with readmissions to a public institution of
higher education for the first semester or other academic term that
