5	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 10, Local Government Code, is

8	Sec. 336.001. AUTHORITY OF CERTAIN NATURE CENTERS TO CHARGE
9	ADMISSION FEE. (a) In this section, "nature center" means a

11	least 30-50 acres that has been assembled for the purpose of
12	preserving this geology or habitat, that provides passive or
13	low-impact recreational activities like hiking, that has limited

development, and that offers educational programs.

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- 17 (c) The board of directors of a not-for-profit entity that

 18 maintains county and municipal park property as a nature center

 19 under a formal agreement may charge an admission fee for entrance

 20 onto or use of the county and municipal property. Any fee must be

 21 approved each year by the county and the municipality.
- 22 (d) Fees collected under this section may be used only to
 23 provide educational programs conducted on, to maintain, or to
 24 construct improvements to the county and municipal property.

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- 1 (e) Fees collected under this section shall be audited 2 annually by an independent auditor. All audit reports shall be 3 submitted to the county and the municipality on completion.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all of the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
