## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT
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- 2 relating to retirement benefits for law enforcement officers
- 3 employed and commissioned by certain institutions of higher
- 4 education.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 811.001, Government Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subdivision (9) and adding Subdivision (19) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (9) "Law enforcement officer" means a member of the
- 10 retirement system who has been commissioned as a law enforcement
- 11 officer by the Department of Public Safety, the Texas Alcoholic
- 12 Beverage Commission, the <u>Texas</u> State Board of Pharmacy, <u>a public</u>
- 13 <u>institution of higher education</u>, or the Parks and Wildlife
- 14 Department and who is recognized as a commissioned law enforcement
- officer by the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and
- 16 Education.
- 17 (19) "Public institution of higher education" means a
- 18 general academic teaching institution, a medical and dental unit,
- 19 or a university system, as those terms are defined by Section
- 20 <u>61.003</u>, Education Code.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 812.003(a), Government Code, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), membership in the
- 24 employee class of the retirement system includes:

- 1 (1) all employees and appointed officers of every
- department, commission, board, agency, or institution of the state
- 3 except:
- 4 (A) (A) independent contractors and their
- 5 employees performing work for the state; and
- (B) [(2)] persons disqualified from membership
- 7 under Section 812.201; and
- 8 (2) all law enforcement officers commissioned and
- 9 employed by a public institution of higher education except persons
- 10 <u>disqualified from membership under Section 812.201</u>.
- SECTION 3. Section 814.104(b), Government Code, is amended
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 (b) A member who is at least 55 years old and who has at
- 14 least 10 years of service credit as a commissioned peace officer
- 15 engaged in criminal law enforcement activities of the Department of
- 16 Public Safety, the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, the <u>Texas</u>
- 17 State Board of Pharmacy, a public institution of higher education,
- or the Parks and Wildlife Department, or as a custodial officer, is
- 19 eligible to retire and receive a service retirement annuity.
- SECTION 4. Section 815.505, Government Code, is amended to
- 21 read as follows:
- Sec. 815.505. CERTIFICATION OF NAMES OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AND
- 23 CUSTODIAL OFFICERS. Not later than the 12th day of the month
- 24 following the month in which a person begins or ceases employment as
- 25 a law enforcement officer or custodial officer, the Public Safety
- 26 Commission, the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, the Parks and
- 27 Wildlife Commission, the Texas State Board of Pharmacy, a public

- 1 <u>institution of higher education</u>, the Board of Pardons and Paroles,
- 2 or the Texas Board of Criminal Justice, as applicable, shall
- 3 certify to the retirement system, in the manner prescribed by the
- 4 system, the name of the employee and such other information as the
- 5 system determines is necessary for the crediting of service and
- 6 financing of benefits under this subtitle.
- 7 SECTION 5. Section 821.001(6), Government Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (6) "Employee" means a person who is employed, as
- 10 determined by the retirement system, on other than a temporary
- 11 basis by an employer for at least one-half time at a regular rate of
- 12 pay comparable to that of other persons employed in similar
- 13 positions. This term does not include a person employed as a law
- 14 enforcement officer by a public institution of higher education as
- that term is defined by Section 811.001.
- SECTION 6. Section 822.002, Government Code, is amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 822.002. EXCEPTIONS TO MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENT. (a)
- 19 An employee of the public school system is not permitted to be a
- 20 member of the retirement system if the employee:
- 21 (1) is eligible and elects to participate in the
- optional retirement program under Chapter 830;
- 23 (2) is solely employed by a public institution of
- 24 higher education that as a condition of employment requires the
- 25 employee to be enrolled as a student in the institution; or
- 26 (3) has retired under the retirement system and has
- 27 not been reinstated to membership pursuant to Section 824.005 or

- 1 824.307.
- 2 (b) A person commissioned and employed as a law enforcement
- 3 officer by a public institution of higher education, as that term is
- 4 defined by Section 811.001, is not a member of the retirement
- 5 system.
- 6 SECTION 7. (a) All persons who were commissioned and
- 7 employed on August 31, 2005, as law enforcement officers by a public
- 8 institution of higher education, as defined by Section 811.001,
- 9 Government Code, as amended by this Act, who were contributing
- 10 members of the Teacher Retirement System of Texas on that date, and
- 11 who remain in employment described by this subsection on September
- 1, 2005, become members of the Employees Retirement System of Texas
- 13 on September 1, 2005.
- 14 (b) Service credit in the Teacher Retirement System of Texas
- 15 as a commissioned law enforcement officer by a person whose
- 16 retirement system membership is transferred under this section is
- 17 considered as if it were service credit in the Employees Retirement
- 18 System of Texas for the purpose of determining eligibility for
- 19 benefits from the Employees Retirement System of Texas.
- 20 (c) A commissioned law enforcement officer who becomes a
- 21 member of the Employees Retirement System of Texas under Subsection
- 22 (a) of this section and who has, before September 1, 2005, initiated
- 23 payments for previous service credit in the Teacher Retirement
- 24 System of Texas under Section 823.202, Government Code, as it
- 25 existed before the repeal of that section, or under Section
- 26 823.302, 823.3021, 823.304, 823.401, 823.402, or 823.501,
- 27 Government Code, may complete the agreed payment plan to establish

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- 1 service credit in the Teacher Retirement System of Texas. Credit
- 2 established under this section is considered as if it were service
- 3 credit in the Employees Retirement System of Texas for the purpose
- 4 of determining eligibility of benefits from the Employees
- 5 Retirement System of Texas.
- 6 (d) At the time of the retirement or death of a person whose
- 7 membership is transferred under this section, the Teacher
- 8 Retirement System of Texas and the Employees Retirement System of
- 9 Texas shall make a computation and transfer of money in the manner
- 10 provided by Section 805.008, Government Code, and the person's
- 11 service credit as a law enforcement officer described by this
- 12 section in the Teacher Retirement System of Texas will be
- 13 transferred to the Employees Retirement System of Texas.
- SECTION 8. Before October 1, 2005, each public institution
- of higher education, as defined by Section 811.001, Government
- 16 Code, as amended by this Act, shall certify to the Employees
- 17 Retirement System of Texas, in the manner prescribed by the
- 18 retirement system, the name of each person employed by the
- 19 institution on September 1, 2005, as a law enforcement officer, as
- 20 defined by Section 811.001, Government Code, as amended by this
- 21 Act, and any other information the system determines is necessary
- 22 for the crediting of service and financing of benefits under
- 23 Subtitle B, Title 8, Government Code.
- 24 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
