Section 62.102(b), Health and Safety Code, is 5 6 amended to read as follows: (b) The period of continuous eligibility may be established 7 at an interval of 6 months beginning immediately upon passage of 8 this Act and ending September 1, 2007 [2005], at which time an 9 interval of 12 months of continuous eligibility will 10 be 11 re-established. 12 SECTION 2. Section 10(c), Chapter 584, Acts of the 77th 13 Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, as amended by Section 2.101, 14 Chapter 198, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, 15 is amended to read as follows: The executive commissioner of the Health and Human 16 (C) Services Commission [or the appropriate state agency operating part 17 18 of the medical assistance program under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,] shall adopt rules required by Section 32.0261, Human 19 Resources Code, as added by this Act, so that the rules take effect 20 21 in accordance with that section not earlier than September 1, 2002, or later than September 1, 2007 [2005]. The rules must provide for 22 a 12-month period of continuous eligibility in accordance with that 23 section for a child whose initial or continued eligibility is 24

1 determined on or after the effective date of the rules.

SECTION 3. If before implementing any provision of this Act a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the waiver or authorization is granted.

8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
