## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the expansion of the Salt Fork Water Quality District
- 3 and the appointment of directors by the commissioners court of each
- 4 county included within the boundaries of the district.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 3, Chapter 1139, Acts of the 76th
- 7 Legislature, Regular Session, 1999, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 3. BOUNDARIES. The boundaries of the district are
- 9 coextensive with the boundaries of Stonewall, Kent, and Garza
- 10 Counties [County].

- 11 SECTION 2. Section 6(c), Chapter 1139, Acts of the 76th
- 12 Legislature, Regular Session, 1999, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 (c) In addition to the rights, privileges, powers, and
- 14 duties provided by the general laws of this state, the [The]
- 15 district may:
- 16 (1) purchase, construct, acquire, own, hold, lease,
- build, repair, improve, extend, reconstruct, maintain, and operate
- 18 works, improvements, facilities, plants, equipment, and appliances
- 19 incident, helpful, or necessary to accomplish the purposes
- 20 described by this Act, inside or outside district boundaries,
- 21 <u>subject to city consent under Section 65.016, Water Code</u>;
- 22 (2) enter into contracts, leases, and other agreements
- 23 with, and accept grants, loans, and other assistance from this
- 24 state, political subdivisions of this state, and other entities;

- 1 (3) borrow money and issue <u>and secure</u> bonds and other
- 2 evidences of indebtedness for the purposes described by this Act,
- 3 if approved by resolution or order adopted by the board of directors
- 4 of the district, as provided by Chapter 65, Water Code, or other
- 5 applicable law; and
- 6 (4) sell salt, water, and other products on terms
- 7 approved by the board of directors of the district.
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 7, Chapter 1139, Acts of the 76th
- 9 Legislature, Regular Session, 1999, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 7. BOARD OF DIRECTORS. (a) The district is governed
- 11 by a board of three [five] directors. The director for position one
- 12 shall be appointed by the Commissioners Court of Stonewall County,
- 13 the director for position two shall be appointed by the
- 14 Commissioners Court of Kent County, and the director for position
- 15 three shall be appointed by the Commissioners Court of Garza
- 16 <u>County</u>.
- 17 (b) To be eligible to serve as a director, a person must be a
- 18 registered voter of the county that the commissioners court making
- 19 the appointment represents [Three of the initial directors shall
- 20 serve terms that expire on September 1, 2003. Two of the initial
- 21 directors shall serve terms that expire on September 1, 2002].
- 22 (c) <u>Directors serve two-year terms beginning on September 1</u>
- 23 of odd-numbered years. The commissioners court may make an
- 24 appointment on or after the 45th day before the date the term begins
- 25 [At the expiration of a term, the commissioners court shall appoint
- 26 a director to serve a term of two years]. If a vacancy occurs on the
- 27 board of directors, the commissioners court that makes the

- 1 appointment for that position under Subsection (a) shall appoint a
- 2 director to serve the remainder of that term.
- 3 (d) Each director must qualify to serve as director in the
- 4 manner provided by Section 49.055, Water Code, except that a bond is
- 5 <u>no</u>t required.
- 6 (e) A director serves until the director's successor has
- 7 qualified.
- 8 [(f) To be eligible to serve as a director, a person must be
- 9 <u>a registered voter in Stonewall County.</u>]
- 10 SECTION 4. The Commissioners Courts of Stonewall, Kent, and
- 11 Garza Counties shall appoint initial directors under Section 7,
- 12 Chapter 1139, Acts of the 76th Legislature, Regular Session, 1999,
- 13 as amended by this Act, as soon as practicable after the effective
- 14 date of this Act. Initial directors shall serve until September 1,
- 15 2007, or until a successor has been appointed and qualified.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
