A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- relating to scholarships for the fifth year of accounting programs at public and private institutions of higher education.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 61.756(a), Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) The board, in consultation with the advisory committee
 8 appointed under Section 61.757, shall determine the [maximum]
 9 amount of any scholarship awarded under this subchapter [is
 10 \$3,000]. The scholarship may be spent by the recipient on the
 11 expenses for tuition, fees, books, supplies, and living expenses
 12 incurred by the student in connection with the student's fifth year
 13 of an accounting program. Scholarships shall be made available to
- 15 <u>(1)</u> institution of higher education; [as defined by 16 Section 61.003 of this code,] or

eligible students attending any:

- 17 (2) any nonprofit independent institution approved by the board under Section 61.222 [of this code].
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 61.757(c), Education Code, is amended to 20 read as follows:
- (c) In addition to any other duties assigned by the board, the advisory committee specifically shall advise the board on:
- 23 (1) how the scholarships provided for under this 24 subchapter should be established and administered to best promote

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- 1 the public purpose of the scholarships;
- 2 (2) the amount of each scholarship and the amount of
- 3 money needed to adequately fund the scholarships; and
- 4 (3) any priorities among the factors identified by
- 5 Section 61.754 [of this code].
- 6 SECTION 3. (a) The changes in law made by this Act apply
- 7 only to the amount of a scholarship awarded under Subchapter N,
- 8 Chapter 61, Education Code, on or after the date this Act takes
- 9 effect. The amount of a scholarship awarded under Subchapter N,
- 10 Chapter 61, Education Code, before the date this Act takes effect is
- 11 governed by the law in effect on the date the scholarship is
- 12 awarded, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 13 (b) Before January 1, 2006, the Texas Higher Education
- 14 Coordinating Board may adopt rules for the administration of
- 15 Section 61.756(a), Education Code, as amended by this Act, in the
- 16 manner provided by law for emergency rules.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
