A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment authorizing the attorney
- 2 general to prosecute certain offenses.
- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Article IV, Texas Constitution, is amended by adding Section 22a to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 22a. (a) To the extent provided by general law, the
- 7 attorney general may represent the state in the district and
- 8 <u>inferior courts in the prosecution of criminal offenses related to</u>
- 9 consumer protection, fraud, insurance, and the financial industry.
- 10 (b) Where a district or county attorney and the attorney
- 11 general have concurrent jurisdiction to prosecute a criminal
- offense, the legislature may provide by general law which attorney
- may prosecute the offense.
- 14 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 8, 2005.
- 16 The ballot shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the
- 17 proposition: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the
- 18 attorney general to prosecute offenses related to consumer
- 19 protection, fraud, insurance, and the financial industry."
