WHEREAS, The county seat, Nacogdoches, is the oldest city in Texas and received its official designation from the Mexican government in 1779; it was home to the state's first newspaper, *Gaceta de Tejas*, and today it maintains several historic landmarks, including the Old Stone Fort, which figured prominently in the quest for Texas independence; and

WHEREAS, Located in the Piney Woods of East Texas, the area boasts a fertile forestland, which has provided residents with prosperous agribusiness, and thriving timber, poultry, and dairy production; and

WHEREAS, With its natural beauty and charm, Nacogdoches County also lends itself to ample recreational activities and outdoor events; the Sam Rayburn Reservoir and Angelina National Forest are both popular sites for camping, hiking, and fishing, and the Blueberry Festival in June is a notable event that celebrates the county's thriving blueberry industry; and
