WHEREAS, A woman of integrity, strength, and generosity, Frankie gave unselfishly of herself to others, and her wisdom, warmth, and valued counsel will not be forgotten by those who knew her; and

WHEREAS, Frankie Moore lived her life to the fullest and was a devoted mother and grandmother, and she leaves behind memories that will be cherished forever by her family and many friends; now, therefore, be it
