WHEREAS, Prior to his military service, Jonathon was a firefighter and a paramedic in Westlake, a deputy at Travis County Precinct 1, and a firefighter with the Ce-Bar Volunteer Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Pabich is a fine example of the patriotic Americans who have made many personal sacrifices to serve in a foreign land at a time of extreme danger; and

WHEREAS, He has demonstrated exceptional dedication and courage during his military missions, and he is truly an inspiration to the citizens of his community and the State of Texas; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Senate of the State of Texas, 79th Legislature, hereby commend Sergeant Jonathon Joseph Pabich for his valor and patriotic service to his country and extend to him sincere best wishes for a complete recovery; and, be it further
