**WHEREAS**, Within the space of only a few years, he would assume greater responsibilities in a variety of positions, including that of assistant to the vice president for Academic Affairs, director of Budgeting and Facilities Planning, and assistant vice president for Administration; in 1986, he was named vice president for Administration, the position from which he is now retiring; and

**WHEREAS**, A distinguished gentleman and an exceptionally talented administrator, Chaney Anderson has been committed to providing a superior educational environment for the young people of Texas, and he has played a major role in making the University of Houston-Downtown the outstanding institution it is today; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, That the Senate of the State of Texas, 79th Legislature, hereby commend T. Chaney Anderson for his many accomplishments and for his contributions to the University of Houston-Downtown; and, be it further

**RESOLVED**, That a copy of this Resolution be prepared for him as an expression of esteem from the Texas Senate.
