IN RE: HB56 by Denny (Relating to the offense of tampering with a direct recording electronic voting machine; providing criminal penalties.), **As Passed 2nd House**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Penal Code by creating the offense of tampering with direct recording electronic voting machine. It is assumed that the number of offenders convicted under this statute would not result in a significant impact on the programs and workload of state corrections agencies or on the demand for resources and services of those agencies.
