IN RE: HB412 by Turner (Relating to the use of credit scoring and credit history by certain telecommunications and electric service providers.), **As Passed 2nd House**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The Public Utility Commission indicates that any costs associated with the bill could be absorbed within the agency's existing resources.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2005.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
