IN RE: HB451 by Dutton (Relating to a study and report by the commissioner of education concerning public school students' campus and school district assignments and transfers, operation of public schools, and public school attendance.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

To meet the bill's requirement to study provisions in Chapter 25, the Texas Education Agency estimates that it would need approximately \$100,000 for one-time contracted services to obtain expert assistance and gather information from school districts and other stakeholders.
