IN RE: HB492 by Woolley (Relating to personal finance education as a requirement for graduation from public high school.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated. It is assumed that the bill as written would not require a separate course in personal finance education but rather would require a personal finance component within existing economics curriculum as a graduation requirement.
