**IN RE: HB560** by Miller (Relating to the placement of traps, deer stands, hunting blinds, wildlife feeders, and other hunting devices.), **As Introduced** 

#### No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would prohibit a person from placing or building a hunting device, including a trap, deer stand, hunting blind, or wildlife feeder less than 200 feet from a property line. Bill provisions would not apply to a landowner who possesses a written agreement with an adjoining landowner. According to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, this bill, if adopted, would have no significant fiscal impact on department operations.

#### **Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
