IN RE: HB639 by Bailey (Relating to complaints against certain peace officers and fire fighters.), **As Introduced**

The bill would require that, when a state agency or political subdivision that employs peace officers or fire fighters receives a written and signed complaint against a peace officer or fire fighter employed by the entity, that the entity must conduct an investigation before disciplinary actions may be taken.
