IN RE: HB651 by McClendon (Relating to the creation of a presumption in certain criminal proceedings as to evidence of a defendant's alcohol concentration determined by an analysis of the defendant's breath, blood, or urine.), **As Introduced**

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would allow certain presumptions at trial when prosecuting an intoxication and alcoholic beverage offense related to operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated.
