IN RE: HB1179 by Dutton (Relating to the authority of an associate judge in certain family law cases.), **As Introduced**

The bill would allow an associate judge hearing family law cases under Subchapter A of Chapter 201 of the Family Code to sign and render a temporary order. Previously, this type of associate judge could only recommend a temporary order to the referring court.
