IN RE: HB1199 by Guillen (Relating to the presence of lead in confectionery.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

According to the Department of State Health Services (DSHS), the agency already has the authority to test candy and other foods for adulterants such as lead, and does so periodically, so there would be no additional fiscal impact on the agency.
