**IN RE: HB1415** by Dunnam (Relating to certain procedures following a violation of community supervision.), **As Introduced**

The bill would clarify that an appeal may not be taken on a determination during a hearing on the determination of whether to proceed to adjudication of guilt on an original charge for a person who has violated a condition of deferred adjudication community supervision.
