**IN RE: HB1459** by Leibowitz (Relating to energy-saving devices and options for vending machines in buildings owned or leased by the state; imposing an administrative fine.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would require energy-saving devices to be installed on certain vending machines located in buildings owned or leased by the state. The amount of utility savings would be minimal compared to current appropriations.

**Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
